CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR MARKED BY SUB-ZERO WEATHER BUT SPIRITS WARM AND GENIALITY PERVADES AIR

In spite of sub-zero weather Christmas and New Year holidays were celebrated in traditional manner. There was a nip in the air but there was also a nip in the glass which was cheerfully passed around and as cheerfully accepted. Here's "tae ye," "Skool," "Bon Sante" and all the kindred expressions, including "Mud in Your Eye" could be heard wherever one went. Midnight Mass at St. Felix Catholic Church and the midnight service at St. Mark's Church were well attended.

ALEX RUSSWURM, STEWART, PASSES

STEWART—Alexander Russwurm, for many years postmaster here, passed away at the home of his sister, Mrs. C. E. Gibson, after a long illness. He was 75 years of age.

Mr. Russwurm came to Stewart from England in 1926 on a visit, shortly after his retirement from the London and Counties Bank of which he was a valued employee. At the time he had no intention of staying but, as the years passed, he became an active participant in the affairs of the community, serving as secretary of the Stewart Board of Trade, secretary of the Portland Canal Lodge, Loyal Order of Moose, chaplain of the Stewart branch, Canadian Legion, warden and licensed lay reader of St. Mark's Anglican Church, manager of the Stewart Public Utilities Limited, and as Justice of the Peace. His quiet and courteous manner endeared him to everyone in the community. He was always ready and willing to do a service.

Practically the entire community turned out at the funeral to bear evidence of the respect and affection which they held for Mr. Russwurm. Services were held in the Moose Home under the auspices of the Portland Canal Lodge, Loyal Order of Moose, and St. Mark's Church. The Defending Circle was represented by the governor, J. P. Garlick; acting vice-governor W. J. Wakefield, acting chaplain J. Wolstenholme, acting past governor W. S. Orr, and Mrs. Tooth, Mrs. Risch, Mrs. Stewart and Mrs. Wakefield. Pallbearers were J. Haahli, J. J. McKenna and D. Geddes, representing the Moose Lodge, and E. Love, F. Lewis and R. Sharp, representing the Canadian Legion.

Rev. C. L. Lomas read the service. Senior Regent Wilkinson led the choir, and Mrs. M. Dickson provided the music. Funeral arrangements were in charge of H. A. Stewart. The ceremony at the graveside was

the auspices of the Portland Canal Lodge, Loyal Order of Moose, and Stewart Branch of the Canadian Legion, the Women's Auxiliary assisted in making the dance a success. Caps, horns, whistles, and confetti contributed to the enjoyment and also the sport, of the participants. Large hampers were raffish winners being P. McLaughlin, Mr. St. Laurent, both of the door prize was won by A. Behnson of Stewart. The dance carried on to 11 o'clock of the morning which a few of the hands it went first footing.
