Ten-inch Ice Blasted at Alice Arm so Tanker can Land—New Smokehouse Here Described

Last night, the Imperial Oil tanker Imperial Nanaimo, again set out for Alice Arm with a cargo of oil after a telegram had been received by the skipper stating that the ice conditions there would be liquidated by repeated charges of dynamite. It was at 10 a.m. Thursday that the Imperial Nanaimo made an effort to crash a 10-inch thick barrier of ice stretching one-half mile out to sea from the dock. Three blasts of dynamite only made a series of small holes in the ice, the captain stated, so the vessel returned to Port Edward and finally for Prince Rupert, arriving here Friday night. The tanker pulled into port with a layer of ice, six inches thick on some sections of the bow. While the vessel was moored here, blasting of the ice was under way at Alice Arm. If the tanker is not able to unload the oil, the supply at Alice Arm will diminish in five days resulting in a shortage of heat and power closing down of Torribit mine until emergency deliveries can be made.

The new vertical conveyor-type kiln for smoking fish which is now being operated by the Prince Rupert Fishermen's Co-operative Association at its plant at Prince Rupert is discussed in an article by A. W. Lantz, associated research engineer, in the latest issue of progress reports of the Pacific Coast Stations of the Research Board of Canada. The new air-condition tunnel is an integral part of this plant on the Prince Rupert waterfront which was recently described in detail in the Daily News. This commercial kiln is the first application of principles employing vertical, continuously-moving conveyor racks to the smoking of fishery products.

A \$1,000,000 ship dedicated to the safety of Canadian mariners on the west coast and to be operated out of Port of Prince Rupert slipped into Vancouver from her builders on Thursday afternoon of this week. It was the motor vessel Alexander Mackenzie, Canada's third new lighthouse tender. Mrs. Ian Mackenzie, widow of the late senator and longtime cabinet minister, officiated at the launching of the 150-foot vessel, twin screw and shallow draft, which will ply northern waters out of Prince Rupert with six officers and a crew of nineteen.

Present extreme weather conditions in this area is making seining operations difficult. At present catches are being made at Kwakshua Pass, Fitzhugh Sound, Helmecken Inlet and Surf Inlet by 45 seining vessels. Crew of the Azurite, Capt. Tommy Dalzell, who brought in the first catch for the Fishermen's Co-operative plant at Fairview yesterday, have quite a story to tell about seining in Surf Inlet in 10 below weather.

One of the seining vessels had 300 tons set yesterday when the lead line of the net snapped. The crew spent six hours mending the net before seining operation could proceed. "The boys were just about dead," one of the crewmen remarked.

The Azurite brought in 40 tons for bait and will leave again this evening.
