



The tanker pulled into port with a layer of ice, six inches thick on some sections of the bow. While the vessel was moored here, blasting of the ice was under way at Alice Arm, If the tanker is not able to unload the oil, the supply at Alice Arm will in a shortage of heat and power

Lantz, associated research engineer, in the latest issue of progress reports of the Pacific Coast Stations of the Research Board of Canada. The new airndition tunnel is an integral part of this plant on the Prince Rupert waterfront which was recently described in detail in the Daily News. This commercial kiln is the first application of principles employing vertical, continuously-moving conveyor racks to the smoking of fishery products.

A \$1,000,000 ship dedicated to the safety of Canadian mariners on the west coast and to be operated out of Port of Prince Rupert supped into Vancouver from her builders on Thursday afternoon of this week. It was motor vessel Alexander Mackenzie, Canada's third new minister, officiated at the launching of the 150-foot vessel, twin screw and shallow draft, which will ply northern waters out of Prince Rupert with six officers and a crew of nineteen.


