Mr. Klotz Gets His Fish -Spawning Survey Is On




Union steamer Chilcotin 8:15-Marning Song Capt. Harry McLean, arrived in port at 4:15 p. m. Friday enroute to south Queen Charlotte Island points. Passengers disembarking here included J. Cook, W. E. Stevenson, N. Rebin, W. Stubbert, F. Syms, Mr. and Mrs. P. Deane, A. Leask and J. Hanson. The Chilcotin which was here again last evening on her return south, leaves the run after this voyage to be replaced by the Camosun.

Almost together two Union Steamship Co. liners arrived in port about 6 o'clock last evening. First in was the Chilcotin, Capt. Harry McLean, from south Queen Charlotte Island points, sailing at 9 p. m. for Vancouver and waypoints A few minutes later came the Coquitlam, Capt. John Boden, which sailed at 11 p. m. for Alice Arm, Stewart and other northern points whence she will return here tomorrow morning to sail south at 1:30 p. m.

For the past few days, three Fisheries Department vessels have been engaged in a herring spawning survey. One of the vessels, the Babine Post, Capt. Neil McDonald, is also engaged in an organized seal hunt in the Butedale area. Inspector on board is Joe Fielding. The other vessels out on a spawning survey are the Arrow Post, Capt. Jack McCall with Inspector Harry Grainger, working around Bella Bella, and the Sooke Post, Capt, George Fritz, with Inspector W. Strachan, in the Skeena River vicinity.

C. P. R. steamer Princess Norah, Capt. Graham Hughes, arrived in port here, at 4:15 Saturday afternoon from Alaska, sailing at 5:30 for Ocean Falls, Vancouver and way points. Passengers embarking here included Leo Doiron and J. Pedersen for Vancouver and W. S. Lythgoe for Ocean Falls.


