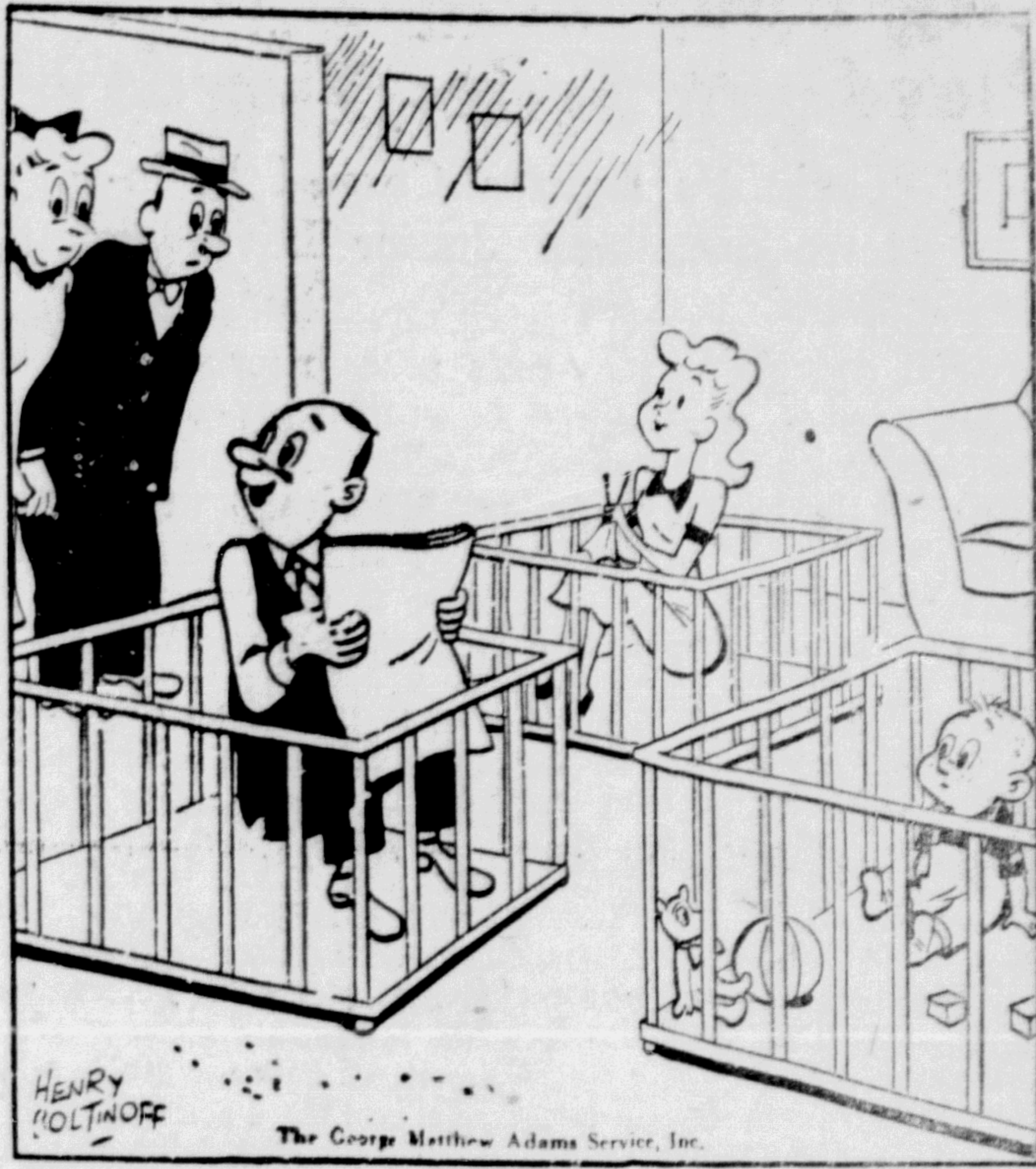


COUSIN OF KING DIES
