CANADA CHARGES SOVIET RUSSIA

PARIS, (P)—Hughes Lapointe, Parliamentary assistant to Hon. Brooke Claxton, minister of defence for Canada, today accused Russia of violating the United Nations charter by refusing to permit Russian wives of foreign citizens to leave Russia. Lapointe told the 58-member legal committee of the Assembly that Canada has had experience with the "paradoxical attitude" of the Soviet towards marriage and the family.

I was very interested in Alderman Casey's letter published recently in your paper regarding the city's telephone system. It seems to me quite reasonable to ascertain the cost of building another telephone exchange to take the overload of the present exchange and what service this second exchange would give. We have examples of other cities in our own province which have added new exchanges as the city expanded. It is reported that the proposed new telephone system, to be built at the cost of half a million dollars, will provide out of revenue the funds to pay off the debt created in its building. Who is to guarantee that the new system will provide the revenue to pay off the debt? If under present rates the new system does not provide the revenue necessary to retire the debt will telephone rates be increased or will taxes be increased in our own home or our business we would save expense wherever possible and municipal business should follow the same principle. We all like service and no doubt the city telephone department would like to give us service but let us creep before we walk.

PEARL HARBOR RECALLED TODAY

"Seven years ago today, December 7, 1941, a gloomy Sunday, Japan precipitated the Pacific War with an attack on the American naval base at Pearl Harbor, an attack which within six months was to see Prince Rupert set up as one of the major military bases of the continent.

The attack was launched with devastating shock effect by more than 100 Japanese planes which caught a large part of the American fleet at anchor and resulted in the sinking of eight battleships and the sinking or damaging of 10 other craft.

More than 3,000 men were killed or missing.

As a result, Canadian forces in the Prince Rupert area were strengthened and American troops and civilians were rushed here to establish an embarkation port which, during the next three and a half years, was a supply base for the whole Pacific area.

Seven years ago today Prince Rupert took a front line position in the world picture, a place which, because of today's events, it still retains.

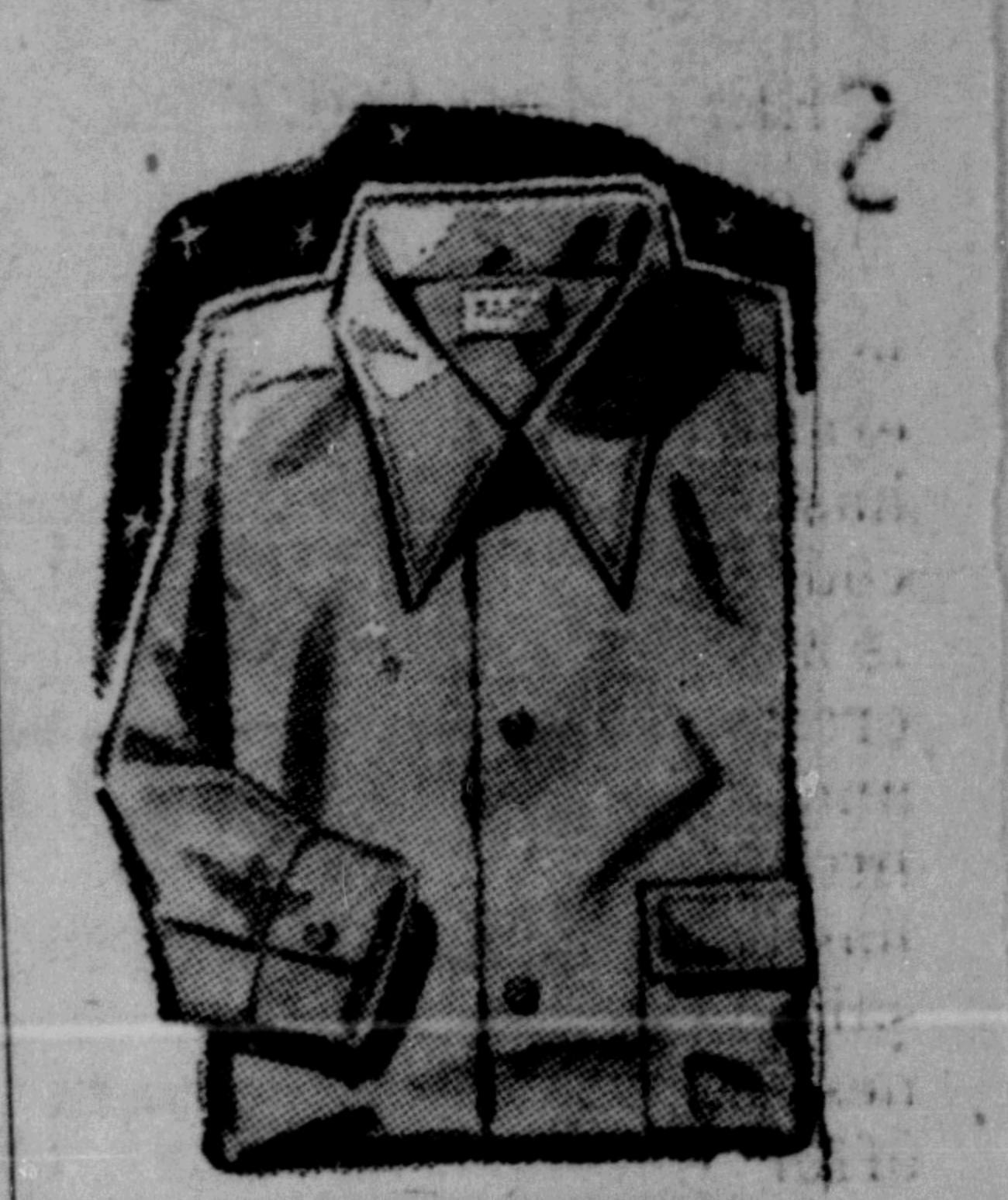
