

MONTREAL-An order for twenty-five de-luxe passenger coaches for the Canadian National Railways was announced here yesterday by R. C. Vaughan C.M.G., Chairman and President of the company. The new cars will be built by Canada Car and Foundry.

The value of equipment orders outstanding for the C.N.R .is now brought to \$35,500,000 sai Mr. Vaughan in reviewing the equipment position of the system. In addition, there is also under way a large modernization and rehabilitation program for passenger equipment in company shops.

"During the war," Mr. Vaughan said, "new passenger equipment could not be obtained and, since the end of hostilities, we have been able to introduce into service only a small number of modern sleeping, parlor and buffet lounge cars, day coaches. dining cars and various types of freight equipment. We are doing everything possible to provide good service and there is hope that the equipment situation will improve in 1949.
