The Warehouse Deal

NNOUNCEMENT was made, with great head-Vilines in the Daily News December 23 last, that the big warehouse on the local waterfront which was built by the United States Army during the war, frad been purchased with the understanding that at least one third of it would be preserved and put to useful purpose. Thursday, it was, to say the least of it, something of a shock to hear suddenly that the building had now been purchased for demolition, the announcement being soon confirmed by the purchaser. Soren Madsen, Edmonton contractor, who will start the work of tearing down on Monday next.

Apparently, something intervened between December 23 and this time to culminate in the surprise announcement of what appears to be a final and definite disposition.

However, as Mr. Madsen says, he is in no hurry about completing the demolition and the "door is still open" for any reasonable negotiations whereby much of the building could still be put to use. In fact, he does not see himself why something could not be done along these lines. Nevertheless, his deal is for demolition and it is with him now that business will have to be done if it is to be saved from such a fate. Whether we like the deal or not and, notwithstanding that some people may feel that we should have had infore warning of what was going to happen, the matter has now reached a realistic point where it seems something will have to be produced by the First Presbyterian Church community itself if the great structure, for which wer we envisioned great possibilities ever since war's end, is to be saved.

EYESORES

A ROUND the Daily News office and elsewhere in the city there is new building going on which will enhance the appearance of Prince Rupert. More new building is in prospect, some of it of really pretentious scale such as the new schools and the projected hotel.

At the same time, there remain many dilapidated evergres, the revolting appearance of which becomes even the more obvious by the presence of the new construction from which they detract.

Some of these notorious structures which continue to mar the scene would appear to have been long due for action and citizens who are solicitous of the appearance of the place and are imbued with al feeling of civic pride and wondering why something is not being done about them.

Possibly, they have been there so long that a lot of people have got used to them, particularly the every day passerby. But to newcomers and visitors they must indeed be a repulsive sight.


