

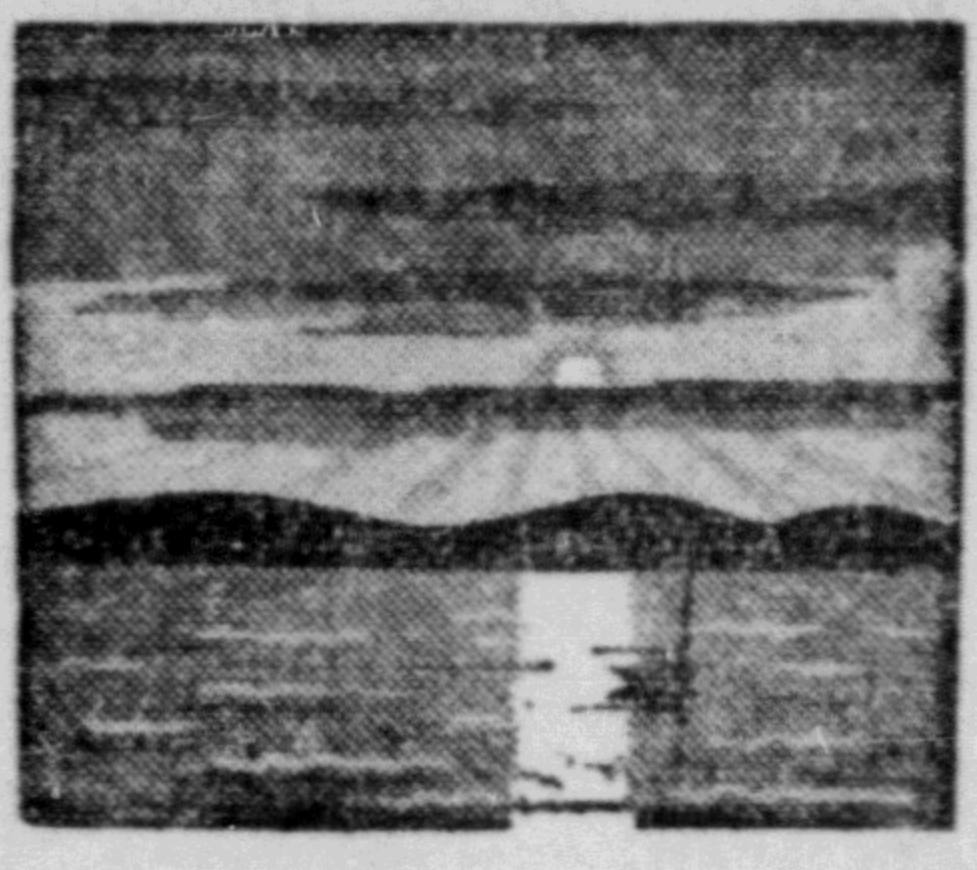

Waterfront - Whiffs

Co-op. Annual Deals With Much Business—Resolutions Passed and Officers Elected Here This Week

The tenth annual meeting of the Prince Rupert Fishermen's Co-operative Association, which has been in session here four days this week, transacted considerable business.

T. H. Sorensen, general manager of the Fishermen's Co-operative Federation, reported sales amounted to six and a half million dollars for 1949,

to the membership. The Fishermen's Co-operative Federation's balance sheet was discussed in detail.

The meeting was informed that amalgamation of the United Fishermen's Co-operative Association, the Kyuquot Trollers' Co-operative Association, and the Sointula Co-operative Association, is now in effect and that the new organization of the amalgamated structure will be known as the Fishermen's Co-operative Association with head office in Vancouver.

presented to the meeting and accepted:

1. That the Department of Public Works be asked to improve harbor facilities at Weah Point, Queen Charlotte Islands, Delkata Slough, Masset, and Squadree Harbor, Stevens Island.

2. That the Department of Fisheries set up a conservation program in regards to coho and spring salmon throughout the total length of the B.C. Coast and that the Department prohibit the commercial catching of coho salmon prior to June 30, providing that the same action can be secured from the Fish and Wild Life Department of the United States Government with respect to the Alaska Fisheries.

3. That the Department of Transport Commissioners be requested to make an early decision to permit the installation of a level road crossing of the Canadian National Railways at Fairview Bay, Prince Rupert.

The Association was instructed to donate a Co-op. and Credit Union book shelf to the High School and Public Library.

Morgan Berg, a member at large of all Fishermen's Co-operatives, gave a brief report on the annual meeting of the Co-operative Congress of Canada, held on March 6 in London, Ontario. There were over forty-seven delegates present at this meeting representing Co-ops in United States, Canada and other European countries.

Don Bentley, a member of the Board of Directors of the B.C. Co-operative Wholesale Society, reported continued growth in this organization and informed the meeting that business transacted during 1949 amounted to \$350,000.

George Viereck, chairman of the Northern B.C. Co-op Council, gave a report on behalf of this organization and informed the meeting that this organization consists of all co-operatives and credit unions from Prince Rupert to Prince George.

Bernhof Pedersen reported on behalf of the B.C. Co-operative Union which has just completed their annual meeting at Penticton, B.C.

George Viereck, secretary of the Prince Rupert Fishermen's Credit Union, advised the membership that they had done a business of approximately four million dollars during 1949 and that this organization was increasing steadily.

For economy reasons, the members were asked that, after the Area 2 halibut season, fish deliveries at the Prince Rupert plant be regulated as much as possible to eliminate the handling of fish on Saturday after-
