## Australia Has Rat Invasion

SIDNEY, Australia (P)—Hordes of rats have invaded outlying stations south of Cooper's Creek, near Lake Frome, south Australia. The influx is believed partly due to an exceptionally wet season.

The rats have not invaded homes or caused any noticeable damage as yet. They are spread over an area of hundreds of miles and people from stations around Lyndhurst and Copely report that the rodents can be seen all over their stations.

Ben Burton, Lands Department Fence Inspector, said that at one time the rats could be seen travelling in millions towards Lake Fome.

He said: "The grass is about a foot high in the area, and they couldn't be seen clearly, but their movements gave the grass the appearance that it was continually moving in a southward direction."

Bill Leslie, part owner of the stations at Moolawatana and Mount Fitton, said the rats apparently subsided in recent weeks. But they might be nesting.

"A few weeks ago," he said, "they were to be seen in millions during the day on our properties. However, in the last couple of weeks they have started to nest and can be seen only at night."

"Fortunately they haven't troubled our homes yet. However this is due to the fact that there is plenty of natural feed about for them."

## Timely Recipes

### Almond Topped Cake

Batter:  
1/2 cup butter or margarine  
1 cup granulated sugar  
2 eggs  
1 teaspoon vanilla extract  
2 cups sifted all-purpose flour  
3/4 teaspoon baking powder  
3/4 teaspoon salt  
3/4 cup milk

Topping:  
1 cup ground blanched almonds  
1/2 cup granulated sugar  
6 tablespoons cream  
1 1/2 teaspoons grated fresh orange rind

Cream butter, add sugar and cream thoroughly. Add beaten eggs and flouring and mix well. Sift flour with baking powder and salt add to creamed mixture alternately with milk. Beat. Pour into paper-lined pan about (8 x 8 x 2 inches). Bake in moderately hot oven (375° F.) 30 to 35 minutes. Remove from oven and spread with well blended topping ingredients. Place under medium broiler heat, and brown about 5 minutes watching carefully to guard against burning. Serves 12 to 14.
