NILS ROBINSON, FISHERMAN, DIES

Nils Robinson, veteran coast halibut and salmon fisherman, who used the first gasboat for salmon trolling in this district and invented a brass spoon which he patented and the type which is now in general use, passed away last Friday afternoon in the Prince Rupert General Hospital. He had come to this coast from steam trawlers out of Vancouver. He had lived in Prince Rupert for many years, and despite great age was active in salmon and halibut fishing until three years ago when he came ashore permanently. Early in the year illness necessitated his entering the Prince Rupert General Hospital and in June he moved to the Pioneers' Home from where he went back to the hospital recently.

Born in Norway January 14, 1867, Mr. Robinson was married but his wife died before he left the Old Country as did also his daughter in infancy.

Surviving relatives include one sister, Mrs. E. Covill in Vancouver and another, Mrs. W. W. McAuley at Van Anda. There are three other sisters and a brother in Norway. Nephews are Richard, Carl and Oscar Giske.

The funeral will take place Tuesday afternoon at the B. C. Undertakers with Rev. Earl Soliland officiating and Ted Rorvik, Sam Haugan, Olof Stegavik, Carl Giske, Oscar Giske and Richard Giske acting as pallbearers.
