Referees Teng and Calderone called 11 fouls on High School and 20 on Peoples.

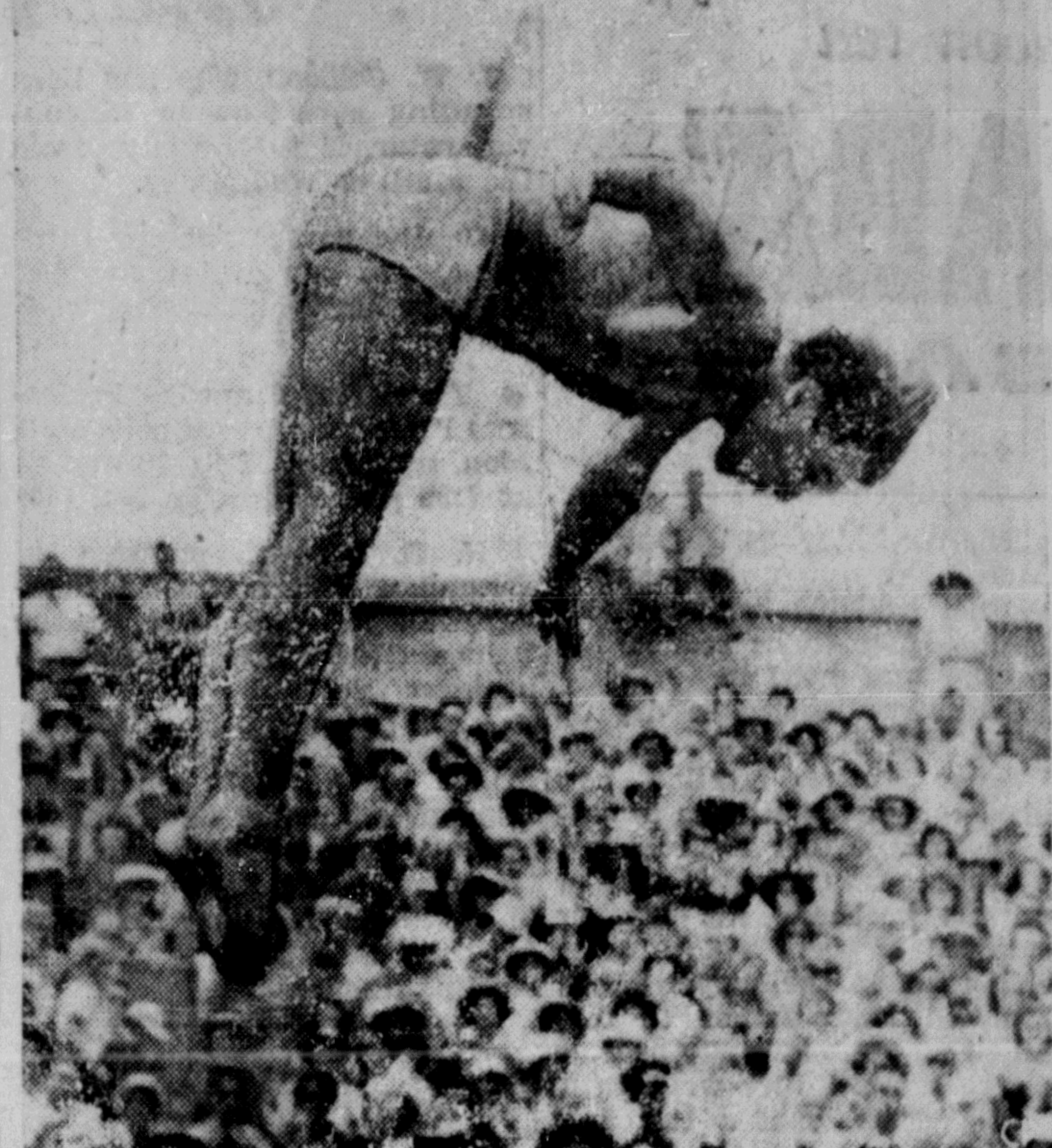
