YIELDING TO TEMPTATION

Pastor Sees Personal Acceptance of Duty and Responsibility As Problem

Tendency of the present generation to go the easy way, yielding to personal interest rather than acceptance of duty and responsibility, was deplored by Rev. George E. Sendall, pastor of First Presbyterian Church, in his morning sermon yesterday.

This trend was to be seen in business and industry as well as spiritual affairs. Personnel was becoming more of a problem than mechanics.

Turning to the field of politics, Mr. Sendall observed that frequently those who assumed power with seeming sincerity of purpose and worthy ideology abused their authority in dictatorship.
