cluding the King Edward Girls' Choir, a Grade Four singing group and a group of singers from Grades Two and Three, each under the direction of Miss Eleanor Moxley, a group from Grades One and Two directed by Miss E. Spence and singers from Grade One under the direction of Mrs. J. Kullander.

From Borden Street School there will be the school choir directed by J. S. Wilson and a rhythm band conducted by Mrs. J. A. Rutherford. Conrad Street School and the Annunciation School will also have two entries in the music division of the festival. Conrad's contribution will consist of a Junior Choir conducted by Miss J. Urquhart and the Conrad Street School Choir conducted by Mrs. H. G. Seaman. The Annunciation School will be represented by a rhythm band under the direction of the Sisters of St. Joseph and the Annunciation School Choir conducted by Sister Mary Lawrence.

Booth Memorial High School leans more toward dramatic presentations and it has entered two plays. One of them, directed by Miss L. Gidney, is a romantic comedy entitled "The Courtship of Marie Jenvrin"; the other is a comedy, "Midge Goes to the Movies," under the direction of E. G. McHallaam. A girls' junior choir, conducted by Miss M. Anstey, makes up the third entry from the high school.

First United Church will be represented by the junior choir, conducted by J. S. Wilson and a group of tiny singers from the kindergarten, directed by Mrs. C. J. O. Olson. The St. Andrew's Church Girls' Choir, under Peter Lien, the First Presbyterian Church Junior Choir, under J. A. Teng, the Annunciation Church Junior Choir, conducted by Sister Mary Lawrence, and Regular Baptist, Mrs. G. R. S. Blackaby, complete the entries from the city churches.

Two plays, "Cottage For Sale," a comedy, and "Bracelet of Doom," a mystery, both directed by Mrs. M. E. Chappel, will be presented by the Prince Rupert Little Theatre.

During the committee meeting members re-affirmed their decision to have the drama section of the festival on a competitive basis and the music division non-competitive. The winner of the senior drama competition will receive a silver cup donated by Mayor Arnold while the group winning the honors in the junior competition will be presented with a silver cup supplied through the office of the director of school and community drama. It was left to the publicity committee to select a suitable award for the individual contributing the best performance in each of the drama competitions. Martin Stuart and Mrs. A. E. Anfield of the program committee were instructed to select a basis by which certificates of merit may be presented to participants in the music division of the festival.

**TERRACE TOPICS**

The biggest building removal job ever undertaken in Terrace was successfully accomplished one day last week when Chris Haugland and Dudley Little got up early in the morning and, before dawn broke, had on the way from the old Army brigade camp a 94 by 24 foot building which was hauled along Lakelse Avenue a distance of about a quarter of a mile to a new location alongside the Little, Haugland and Kerr office and store building to which it will become an addition to provide necessary augmented space.
