Prince Rupert Is Assured
Of Place In B.C. Finals

Don Forward Reports on Annual
Association Meeting in Nanaimo

Prince Rupert Jets, winner of the 1949 Senior "B"
basketball title and the B. C. Championship, are sure
of a place in the finals next spring. Where the games
will be played depends on the play-off draw held early
in the New Year. Because of the heavy travelling ex-
penses involved if Prince Rupert plays away from

home or if the semi final winner
travels here it was the decision
of the B. C. Basketball Associa-
tion, at their meeting held Sun-
day in Nanaimo, that Prince Ru-
pert would receive an automatic
bye into the finals.

The annual meeting of the B.
C. Association, officially recog-
nized Northern B. C. as a district
with full voting powers. Another
new district was taken into the
Association, that of the Kooten-
ays.

The annual elections resulted
in the appointment of Harry
Chapman, as President for the
next two years, Ralph Ladd, Port
Alberni was again elected regis-
trar, with W. Rickaby, Lower
Mainland; Tommy Carson, Van-
couver Island; Andy Bennie, In-
terior, and Don Forward, Prince
Rupert elected as council mem-
bers. The positions of Secretary
and Treasurer were left unfilled,
the appointments to be made by
the executive.

The meeting approved the plan
of the Northern district to invite
native teams into the B. C. or-
ganization, and District Repre-
sentative D. Forward, will en-
deavor to have all these teams
sign up in the Senior division
with the winner of the annual
Native Tournament entitled to
play Prince Rupert in the dis-
trict finals for the right to enter
the B. C. Senior B playoffs.

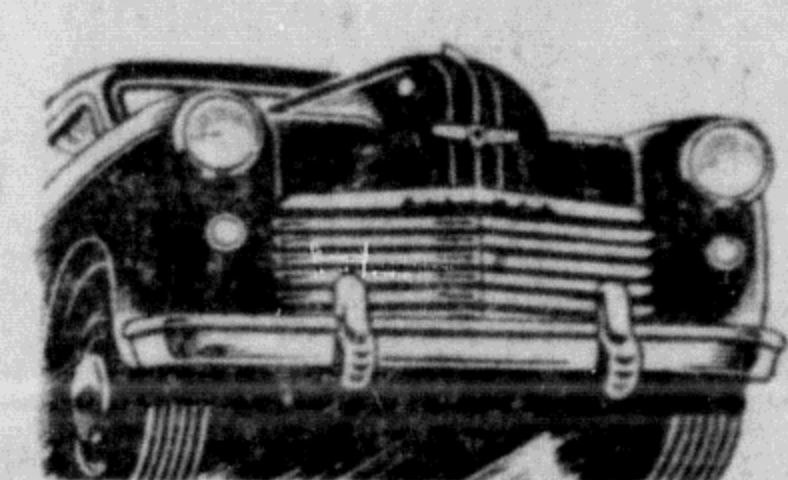
