DICK LETOUNEAU IS LEADING CITY BASEBALL PITCHERS

With the weatherman doing his best to interfere with the baseball schedule the official scorer has had an opportunity to get up to date on pitching records, and the facts reveal some controversial points. "Workhorse" Dick Letourneau has the most wins, four, but at the same time has the greatest number of losses, along with Rosedale.

In winning only one league game Rosedale has the best earned run average among pitchers with a substantial number of innings to their credit. The earned run average is judged on the number of earned runs scored against the pitcher on the basis of a nine inning game. In this respect Lindsay is at the bottom of the list with a figure of 4 runs per game, this in spite of a record of 16 strike-outs in one game.

Maundrell has the distinction of having won and lost a game without having an earned run scored against him.

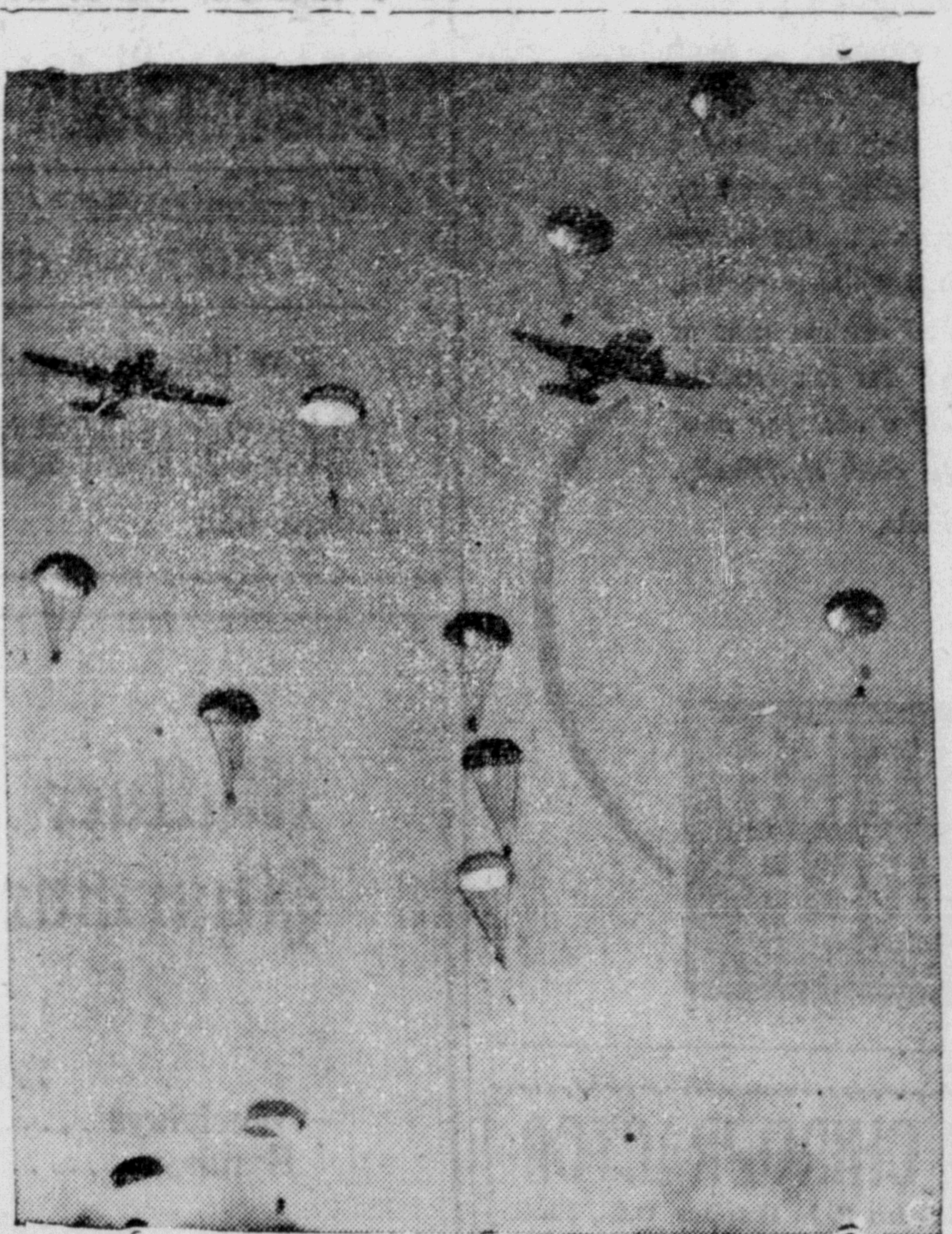
