SCHEVENINGEN, Netherlands—The International shipping federation representing ship owners of 14 countries including Canada met yesterday to discuss the threatened union boycott of Panamanian shipping. The boycott was ordered April 18 by the seafarers section of the International Transport Workers federation. The union said it was to "stop the unscrupulous practices of ship owners who have switched to Panamanian and similar flags to enforce adequate living and working conditions in these ships."

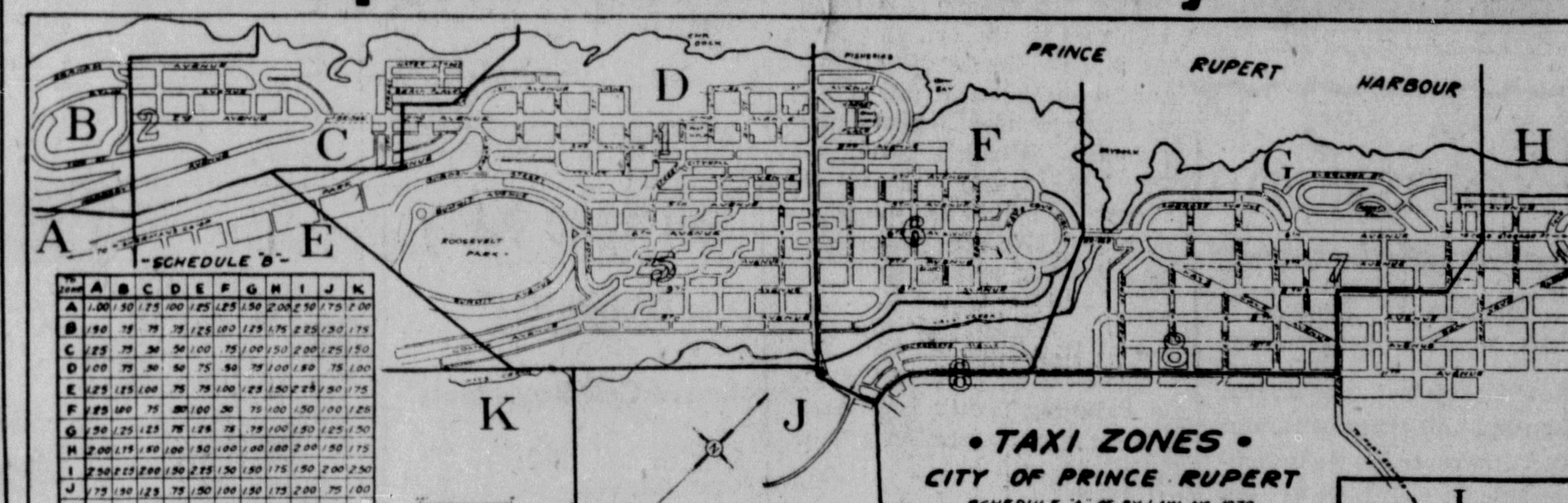
