Season's Coldest Weather Is TORITZ, Switzerland (9)— turbulent Olympic Winfollowed by Epidemic of Fires

Coldest weather so far this winter—a brisk 13 rteen of which scored no degrees of frost—set many a Prince Rupert householder thawing his water pipes this morning and had 241/4 points, ten gave the city fire department its busiest morning in key, ten for Barbara Ana weeks as shivering citizens wielded blow torches and stoked their heating plants too exuberantly.

Overnight official minimum. which has set a winter's record to date, was 19 degrees above, seven degrees lower than Sunnight. However, Sunday night's frost was abetted by light preeze that penetrated homes and made heating a greater problem. There was no wind last night

Peter Anderson of Astoria was drowned when a dinghy capsiz-1434 ed as he was taking a pilot from a freighter at the mouth of the Columbia River.

A fifth unidentified seaman was washed overboard from the tanker Tidewater at Near Bay. Washington. The tugs Rosalie, Belmont
