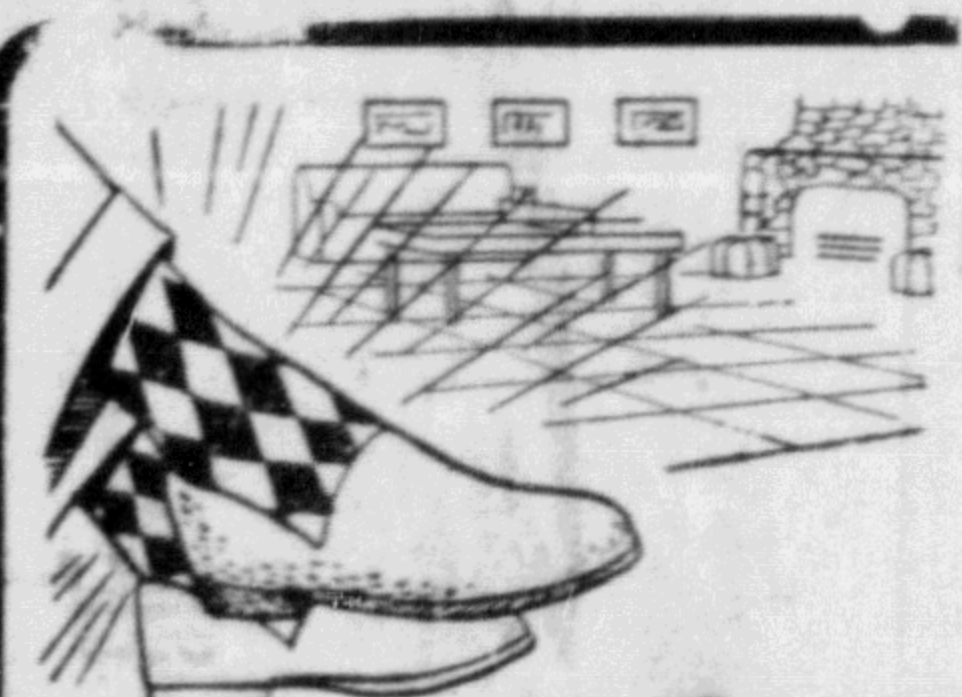


MORE SWIM MARKS FALL
