EXECUTIVE OF LEGION MEETS

Agenda for Regular General
Session Considered

A meeting of the executive
committee of the Canadian
Legion continued until nearly
midnight last night discussing
the many items that will come
before the regular monthly
meeting of the local branch to-
night. Among the items under
discussion were the plans made
for "Legion Week" which will
open with the annual "Peggy
Day" on Saturday, November 4,
and finish up on Friday, Novem-
ber 11. Arrangements were
made for the annual Armistice
Day parade and banquet on
November 11.

Tentative plans were also
made in connection with the
proposed B.C. provincial con-
vention of the Canadian Legion
which is scheduled to be held
in Prince Rupert from May 26
to May 28, 1945 and which will
come up for final approval by
the executive council of the B.
C. Provincial Command at Van-
couver on Friday and Saturday
of this week.

Other items included a bene-
fit dance scheduled for October
22, co-operation in any activi-
ties planned for United Nations
Day, Sunday, October 23, the
necessity of early consideration
being given by the city for ad-
ditional ground being provided
and prepared as a soldier's place,
requests for donations, contri-
bution being given to a change
in the class of license held by
the Legion. All these matters
will come up for discussion and
approval by the regular monthly
meeting in the Legion Hall
tonight. Initiation of new mem-
bers will also take place to-
night.

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
