Britain Fights Guerrilla Band In Malay Jungle

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaya (Reuters)—The war Britain has been fighting in Malaya for the last two years is one without a front line.

It has few pitched battles. It flares briefly around an isolated rubber plantation, a tin mine deep in the jungle, a village in a clearing.

Out of the tropical forest come the "faceless men"—the enemy—dressed in black or jungle green, armed with rifles, knives and tommy-guns.

A few hours later they fade again into the green undergrowth, leaving behind the blazing wreck of a rubber store, the bullet-ridden bodies of European planters, the hacked corpses of Chinese who would not cooperate.

How many they are, even who they are, no one knows for sure. But for two years they have tied down British and Malayan forces vastly superior in numbers and equipment, and the acts of terrorism are increasing. It is reported that "incidents" in October totalled more than 500.

They began soon after the end of the war. After three years of Japanese occupation, most of the peninsula's heterogeneous population was glad to see the British back.

LONG PENINSULA The Malaya Federation occupies a peninsula reaching down from the continental mass of southeast Asia towards the Indonesian Archipelago.

The Federation covers about 50,680 square miles. Its capital is Kuala Lumpur, some 30 miles from the coast and about 200 miles northwest of Singapore, the independent British colony that occupies the "toe" of the peninsula.

The 1947 population of almost 5,000,000 included 2,400,000 Malaya, 1,820,000 Chinese, 530,000 Indians and 9,600 Europeans.

In June, 1948, the British authorities, alarmed by the spread of terrorism, declared a state of emergency throughout the whole federation.

Malcolm MacDonald, British commissioner-general for southeast Asia, said the capture of key agitators had foiled a Communist plan to overthrow the Malayan government and set up a Soviet republic.

In August the Communist forces were estimated at 10,000, almost all Chinese, with modern weapons to arm 4,000. British forces, consisting of about a division when the terrorist offensive began, were strengthened. Police numbered about 29,000.

THE "BRIGGS PLAN" In March this year the British government appointed a "strong man" to co-ordinate the campaign against the terrorists.

They chose Lt.-Gen. Sir Harold Rawson Briggs, 55-year-old wartime army commander in the Middle and Far East. He formulated the widely-publicized "Briggs Plan." Its details have never been officially made known, but its mainpiping was understood to be the "domination of populated areas."

Security forces believed the terrorists could not have held out for so long without help from the civilian population. They thought this help came mostly from 300,000 Chinese squatters scattered throughout the peninsula.

Got Bird Bag In Spite of Weather

Howling northeast gales, blinding snow blizzards and unusual ice conditions hampered the hunting operations of Capt. Bill Husoy and party of four local nimrods who returned Saturday afternoon aboard the Fredella III from a nine-day trip to Hartley Bay and adjacent waters.

All but nine days were spent battling ice or waiting out storms out of three days of good hunting at Hartley Bay, Gilters and Kaitaway Inlet, Hawkesbury Island, eighteen geese and 75 Mallards were bagged.

Kildala Inlet was completely locked and the effort to enter there was given up after two inches of ice was encountered with three-quarters of a mile still to go. Long Inlet in Gardner Canal was also frozen up.

under government controls, the guerrillas would lose their main source of food and shelter and could be left to rot in the jungle.

The "Briggs Plan" began to operate June 1. Colonial Secretary James Griffiths, back from a visit to Malaya, told the House of Commons June 12 not to expect quick and spectacular results.

From the beginning of the emergency until the end of July, 1,948 civilians were killed, wounded or missing. Of these, 688 were Chinese, 334 Malays, 139 Indians, 74 Europeans and 19 Indonesians.

In the same period, 2,539 terrorists, mostly Chinese, were killed, wounded or captured. Police lost 445 killed and 467 wounded.

Up to the end of June, British Army casualties numbered 113 killed and 188 wounded.
