**Gunners Defeat General Motors 2-0 Monday Evening**

In a hard-fought game last evening the Heavy Battery continued their winning ways. Although they had only ten players on the field they blanketed the General Motors, winning by two goals to nil.

Exchanges were even at the start until Pavlikis nipped in fast to snatch a loose ball but shot wide. Motors were pressing and Ferguson came through to clear well. Mercer shot just wide. Pavlikis sent Vanetta ahead but Sunberg saved. The General Motors defence got into a tangle but Boulter was right on the job to clear an awkward twisting miskick of a defender. Dunbar cleared from Currie and a moment later stopped Mercer. Morgan cleared from Owens. McKay crossed well but Gomez cleared. Currie and Wilson combined until Veitch broke up the move. Robinson made a fine interception when Parkhouse and Pavlikis were dangerous. Pavlikis made a good run and Boulter came out and cleared.

The Motors halfback line of Olson, Lien, and Haugan were strong defenders but the forwards were ineffective. Owens missed an opening and Dunbar headed away Currie's good shot. Owens crossed a beauty but Gomez and then Morgan saved. Parkhouse was good and Vanetta got away to drive in a great shot that Boulter got his fingers to and turned against the bar but could not stop. The Battery was then a goal up. Morgan saved Olson's long shot. Then Mercer headed the ball against the underside of the crossbar for it to rebound into play. A lucky escape for Battery. Morgan brought off a great save from Currie and then, with Pavlikis nearby through, Robinson came to the rescue.

The second half found opening exchanges even. Currie's good centre was blocked and, in a flash, Pavlikis was nearly through at the other end. Sunberg was good and Pat Wilson hit the upright with a fine drive. Mazzone cleared. John Wilson made a good run with Currie and McKay carrying it on but Morgan saved. Gomez fought his way through and gave Ward a nice pass from which the latter scored with a great drive to put the Gunners two up. Motors came right back and Morgan saved from Currie. Pavlikis was through but missed. Olson gave Morgan a long shot that

the goalie cleared well. Veitch and Mazzone sent their forwards ahead and Pavlikis worked his way through to shoot from close in and Boulter saved when the ball appeared to have passed through his legs.
