Good Resolution

RENCE Rupert can take satisfaction out of several of the resolutions that were passed at he annual convention of the Associated Boards of Trade of Central British Columbia at Prince George last week and not the least satisfying is that which calls for the blacktopping of the Northern Trans-Provincial Highway easteward from Prince Rupert. Incidentally, the resolution was not actually sponsored by Prince Rupert but by Hazelton.

In hormal trunk road projects, where both ends are accessible, it is usual practice to work from both ends and it would seem to be very sensible to do so in this case. An important reason to support the resolution which was developed at Prince George was that asphalt and other materials could be landed more cheaply at Prince Rupert than it would be to haul them all the way from Vancouver. This is all the more reason, of course, for undertaking the work from Prince Rupert and work from both ends.

The important thing is to induce the public works department, under the ministership of Mr. Carson, to at least somewhat relax its apparent policy that all public works should radiate from the south and let the rest of the country wait.

GOOD PRESIDENT

THE Associated Boards of Trade of Central British Columbia has got itself a good president in Joe Scott of Prince Rupert and we, his friends here should know it. Having worked closely in association with Mr. Scott in the local Chamber of Commerce and other organizations during the past years, we have found that, when there is a job needs doing, particularly a big and special one, Mr. Scott is the one who can do it.

The Associated Boards will get strong leadership and sensible action under Joe Scott and, with him at the helm, can be assured of a good and useful year ahead.

ABILITY RECOGNIZED

\//HILE some may not have fared so favorably, W notable recognition has come from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police to at least one officer of the British Columbia Police under the new regime. That is Inspector F. B. Woods-Johnson of Prince Rupert whose appointment as training officer for the whole R.C.M.P. force at Regina was announced on Saturday.

Inspector Woods-Johnson has been known here as a quiet, unostentatious officer who has been able to exercise authority and command respect both

from his men and from the public.

He will have a very special job to do at Regina and his progress with the Dominion force, which has imposed special responsibility in him, will be watched with interest.
