Pr. Rupert Takes 12-1 Victory

Pitcher Eliuk and Locals Score Big Win In Baseball at Ketchikan

Supported by a hard-hitting, clean fielding team, Pitcher George Eliuk led Prince Rupert All-Stars to a 12-1 victory over Ketchikan in the fourth game of the international baseball series at Ketchikan ball park Sunday evening.

The visiting Prince Rupert team almost tripled

its 4-0 lead in the sixth inning when they brought in seven runs to set the score at 11-0. Ketchikan supporters got a bad case of the blues when first baseman Joe Davis lobbed one over the right field fence for a home run. The victory was Prince Rupert's third over their ancient Ketchikan rivals in the current annual series. They took two games and tied a third at Prince Rupert during the Dominion Day section of the play-offs last Wednesday and Thursday.

To smiling George Eliuk, Prince Rupert's first string pitcher, the game was a real triumph. He held the Alaskans hitless and scoreless for five innings and then allowed only one run—a triple by Ketchikan first baseman Millard—which scored the northerners' only run.

In seven innings on the mound, Eliuk allowed only two bases on balls and struck one batter with a pitched ball. Ketchikan employed three hurlers against the invaders, Graff, Wigg and Jim Diehl in an effort to stem Prince Rupert's hitting power.

Joe Davis opened the hitting in the second with a single, but was tagged at third. Windle and Pavlikis each got on base on fielder's choice plays and were brought home when Don Hartwig delivered a double to left field. Hartwig was left on base when the side retired.

In the third, Prince Rupert garnered two more runs. This time Eliuk played the heroic when he delivered a single with the bases loaded. He scored Dahl

and Davis. Dahl had got on base on a fielder's choice and Davis on an error by Ludwigson.

Wigg replaced Graff on the Ketchikan mound in the third and both sides remained hitless during the fourth and fifth. In the sixth, however, Prince Rupert caught up with Wigg.

Here is the record of the sixth inning: Eliuk got on base on a fumble by Erickson. Pavlikis singled. Hartwig got on base on an error by Erickson. Morgan singled, scoring Eliuk. Minor Simundson doubled with bases loaded, scoring Pavlikis and Hartwig. Bruce Simundson bunted, got on base on a fielder's choice, scoring Morgan. Dahl attempted a bunt which scored Minor Simundson while Bruce Simundson was tagged at second base. Dahl doubled. Davis hit a home run that scored Dahl as well. Eliuk got on base on an error by Millard. Pavlikis singled but was tagged for the third out on a run to second.

Prince Rupert's twelfth run was scored by Don Hartwig who had got a base on balls and came home on a fielder's error.

Dahl's double in the sixth inning came very close to being the first home run of the game. The pellet soared in a high arc into right field but failed to clear the top of the boundary fence by only a few inches and bounced back practically into the fielder's hands.

The second and third games of the second part of the series are scheduled for today.
