

O'Leary Drowned in Car Mishap

Coroner's Jury Finds Gordon

DEATH ACCIDENT

A verdict of accidental death by drowning was brought in by a coroner's jury which Saturday afternoon investigated the highway mishap which claimed th life early Friday morning of Gordon Ernest Patrick O'Leary, 35-year old city taxi driver.

O'Leary was the driver of a taxi which plunged over an embankment a little more than mile from Port Edward while apparently returning to Prince Rupert. The damaged, overturned vehicle which held his body was not discovered until several hours later.

The jury found that O'Leary "met his death early in the morning of July 2, one and one fifth miles from Port Edward on steering rod. However, no indithe highway to Prince Rupert by drowning in a car he was driving and which accidentally the break had occurred before left the highway and plunged or during the accident. into the water.

the damage was given by Arthur ed O'Leary, testified that O'Leary E. Krock, mechanical foreman was a careful driver and had ard, Baldwin-Walland that he was unable to tell on taxi business. whether or not the chicle had had any defects prior to the accident.

Constable H. E. J. Medley of the provincial police Port Edward detachment, testified that the car had travelled along the left-hand edge of the road, close to the 15-foot embankment before it finally plunged into the

O'Leary's body had been removed from the back seat of the damaged car, he said.

Dr. R. E. Colman, pathologist, who performed an autopsy on O'Leary's body, testified that drowning was the cause of death.

Howard Wright, bus driver, said that he had reported seeing the vehicle to Constable Medley shortly before 8 o'clock on the morning of July 2. He had failed to see the car while on a trip to Port Edward but saw it shortly after he had began his return trip to Prince Ru-

Arnold Bristow, engineer at the Miller Bay Hospital, said that he saw a car which he was "positive" was the one driven by O'Leary, at the hospital at midnight, July 1. The vehicle was leaving the hospital grounds and was being driven in a normal manner, he said.
