Blackwood On Bridge

To emphasize an important point, I want you to bid this hand. Suppose you held:

S-QJ743 H-None D-A764 C-K652

Say your partner opened the bidding with one heart. You would bid one spade. All right so far. Now your partner bids two hearts. What do you do?

Tough, isn't it? The only available bids which seem to be within the bounds of reason are two spades, three clubs, three diamonds and two no trump. Yes, it's tough to find A BID. But the solution itself is easy. I suggest that you do not bid at all. I recommend a pass. If the opponents were good defenders I would pass even with a little stronger hand than the one shown.

Did somebody say you should bid again because you "can't stand" two hearts? I hope not. To answer that let me ask a question of my own: can you stand three hearts? Because that is the bid you are most likely to hear next from partner.

The point is that this hand is a misfit and that means danger. In general it is wise, of course, to probe around to find a fit with partner. But on hands which are obviously misfits, such probing is a luxury which you will do well to forego. Remember with every bid you are getting higher and higher... and closer to the point where the opponents will start doubling. This is what to do with the bidding when you recognize a misfit. Drop it. Drop it fast.

Look what happened to that sterling partnership of Miss Brash and Mr. Muzzy. Neither one would give in. Neither could "stand" the other's suit. Mr. Muzzy, for example, couldn't stand two diamonds, undoubted. So he soon found himself standing five diamonds, doubled. But Miss Brash is even more to blame. She should have passed two spades.

Mr. Champion opened the queen of clubs which Miss Brash won with the ace. With no hesitation at all, she fired back the nine of spades hoping to catch Mr. Champion napping. Not Mr. Champion! He had heard Miss Brash deny all those spade bids. He didn't have to see a singleton to know it was there. So right up with the ace he went. He then cashed the ace of hearts and two more club tricks. And there was no way to keep him from winning two diamond tricks later. Down 1100!
