On yesterday's hand he made a rather nice play and was roundly complimented by Mr. Dale. Appreciating these kind words, he seemed to have his mind made up to earn some more of them. Today's hand offered him that opportunity. South dealer.

Mr. Champion opened the King of hearts and followed with the ace of that suit. A third heart lead was ruffed by Mr. Masters with the eight of trumps. The four of clubs was returned and Mr. Abel won with the ace.

Three rounds of trumps were now taken and the success of the hand obviously depends on the diamond finesse, which can be taken either way. In a care-less mood induced by a brow-beating partner, Mr. Abel might have taken the diamond finesse at this point—and taken it wrong.

But he didn't. Instead he next led a club to the king in dummy and a club back, which he ruffed. Now he has a full count. East had shown a singleton spade and a singleton heart, which meant that West had started with six hearts and three spades. And West had followed to three club leads.

That's 12 cards, so it is clear that Mr. Champion has not more than one diamond. Mr. Abel therefore led a low diamond to the king, then led the nine of diamonds back and let it ride with the successful finesse an
