## ADANACS ARE HEADING EAST

To Meet Cornwall or Hamilton For Mann Cup

VANCOUVER—Early next Sunday morning, October 10, New Westminster Adanacs will board a TransCanada Air Lines plane at Vancouver Airport on their way to Toronto where they will meet either Cornwall Seniors or Hamilton Tigers at Mape Leaf Gardens in a best-of-five series for the Mann Cup, emblematic of senior lacrosse supremacy in Canada.

In charge of Manager Brud Matheson and Coach Truck MacDonald, the western Canada champions will reach Toronto early Sunday evening.

A full twenty-one in all will leave at 1 a.m. in a chartered aircraft.

Following the series the players will also return by T.C.A. leaving Toronto on the morning of October 21.

Cornwall and Hamilton meet tonight (Wednesday) in the final of a three-game series to decide an Eastern Canada winner. Each team has won one game to date.

declared that New Zealand set a good example to the world by trying to remove racial discrimination and the principle should be adhered to without deviation.

## Sport Shots

South Africa's racial problems are having repercussions in New Zealand where strong feeling is being shown against the decision of the New Zealand Rugby Union to exclude Maoris from the rugby team that is to tour South Africa next year. Unlike in South Africa, the natives of New Zealand have complete equality with Europeans in all respects and both races show the strongest resentment of any suggestion of a color bar. Maoris are excellent footballers and on merit would be certain to make the team.

teams touring New Zealand have played against all-Maori teams and a good spirit has prevailed, but difficulties would inevitably develop in South Africa off the field of play. Maoris would be barred from some accommodation and there would be a likelihood of unpleasantness at social functions. While greatly regretting the situation, the New Zealand Rugby Union takes the view that South African views on the color question must be respected in their own country and it is unwilling to submit Maoris to the risk of humiliation.

Critics of the decision, both Maori and European, assert that if South Africa is unwilling to receive a fully representative New Zealand team, the tour should not take place. The Wellington Waterside Workers' Union passed a resolution asking the authorities to abandon the tour if Maoris could not be selected. It termed the exclusion of Maoris as "an insult to our Maori friends." Speakers

The New Zealand Rugby Union's decision to exclude them was purely to avoid international friction and to guard against incidents through discrimination against the Maoris in South Africa. South African
