Governor Gruening declined to comment as to the possibilities of his own political future. It has been predicted that he is pretty certain to remain as governor for at least another four years by which time, under statehood, the office will have become elective.

DELAYS FLIGHT**

Bad weather in the southern part of the province was responsible for delaying today's Canadian Pacific Air Lines flight to Sandspit because the southern leg of the flight was unable to make scheduled connection at the Island air strip.

The Prince Rupert-Sandspit flight left at 2 o'clock instead of 1 o'clock, as scheduled, remaining here for an hour rather than cause passengers to wait at Sandspit for the arrival of the Vancouver plane.

The delay is also causing the Prince Rupert-Sandspit flight to remain at Sandspit over tonight. Because of the short period of daylight in the afternoon, the returning flight will remain at Sandspit until tomorrow morning, rather than attempt a late landing here.
