






Keeping Skeena River Clear of Snags-Blue Jay Going to Ketchikan

Although the snagboat Essington is still at the dry dock where a major overhaul job having taken longer than was anticipated and the vessel not being due out before July 5, the work of keeping the Skeena River clear of snags and other obstructions as the fishing season opens is not being neglected. The local service boat F. H. Phippen, Capt. Cecil Morrison, has been pressed into service and has just carried out five days work under direction of Capt. W. F. Robertson of the Essington and with members of the Essington crew on board. Such other snag work as is necessary will be carried out by the Phippen pending the return to service of the Essington.

Tommy Fraser's well known power boat Blue Jay is to make Ketchikan its new home port-Following Tommy's departure for New Hazelton, the smart little vessel has been sold to Terry Myser, who was located here with the United States Army during the war and now makes his home at the First City. The Blue Jay will be shipped north at an early date.
