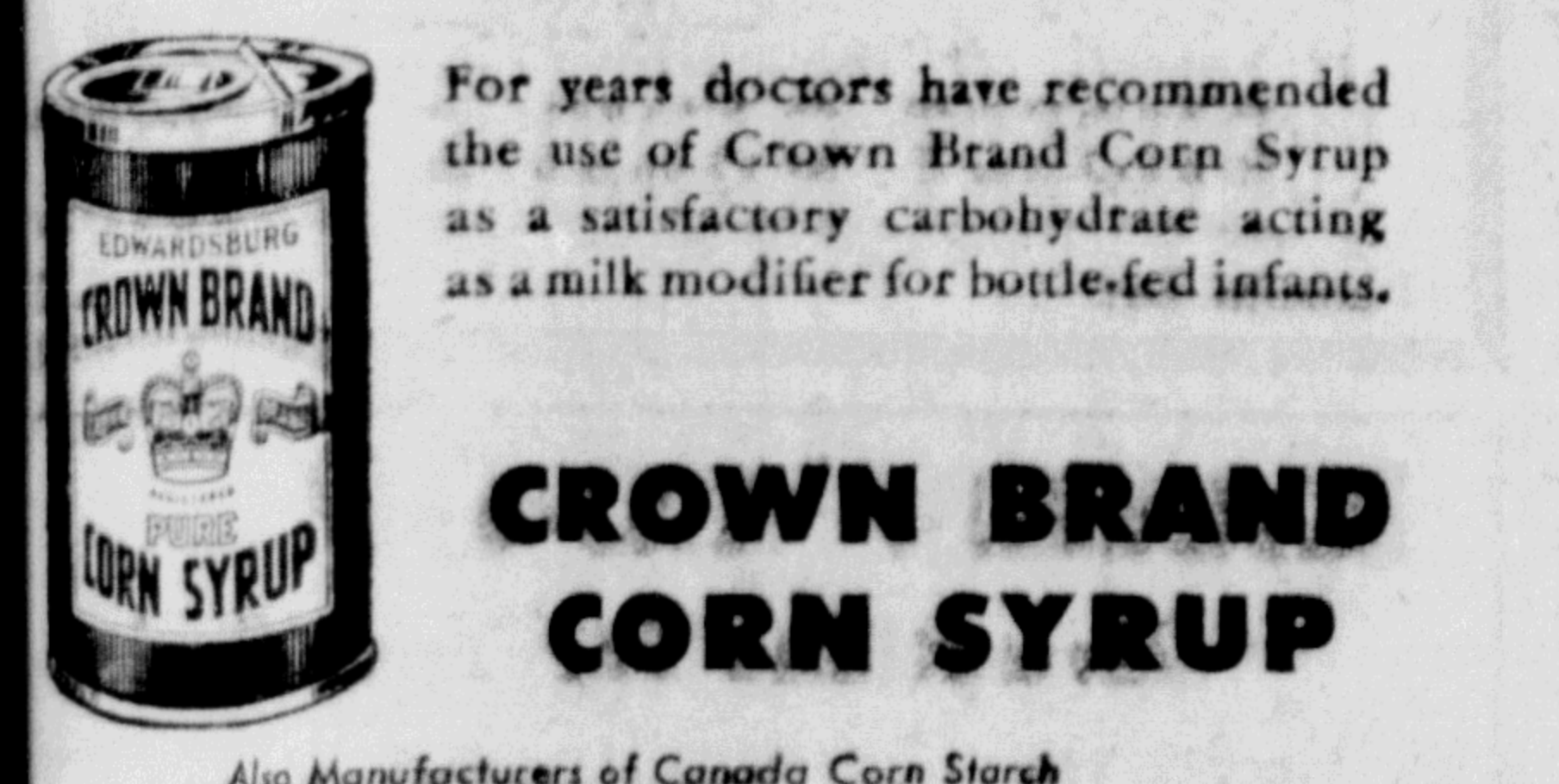


Recipe

FORESTERS TRAIN TO BATTLE PESTS

GREEN TIMBERS, B.C. g—At Green Timbers forestry station, 20 miles southeast of Vancouver on the TransCanada Highway, forest rangers and their assistants are being taught to conserve and replenish timber. This school established by the B.C. forest service three years ago has proven successful and permanent classrooms and offices will be built to replace present temporary quarters. Among many subjects taught are fire law, Forest Act regulations, meteorology, fire behaviour and protection planning public relations, radio communications, telephone line construction and maintenance, trail ad forest road construction. Also emphasized are practical surveying, tree diseases, insects, botany and wood technology. Field trips are made in the 640 acres of timber plantation surrounding the station.

PRINCE RUPERT YEARS AGO

APRIL 14, 1923
A northern British Columbia delegation arrived in Ottawa to interview government members to urge the construction of a grain elevator at Prince Rupert. Delegates were Hon. T. D. Pattullo, E. C. Gibbons, S. J. McLeod, C. H. Orme and Olof Hanson.

The city council refused to appoint a representative to an arbitration board in a dispute with the Civic Employees Union despite a petition containing 750 names which urged it to do so.

On behalf of himself and Belgian interests, Alderman Theo Collart announced that he had bonded the Spider group of mining claims at Stewart and that work would begin as soon as a \$2,000,000 company, which was to be formed was incorporated.
