CHICAGO (P)—Argentine Cesar Brion is the first road block sprawled before former heavyweight champion Joe Louis in his projected shuffle up the long trail back to the top in Pistiana. Ironically, the foe Joe will oppose at Chicago Stadium November 29 has one asset—youth—which apparently weighed so heavily against Louis when he was pummeled by Champion Ezzard Charles at New York September 27.
