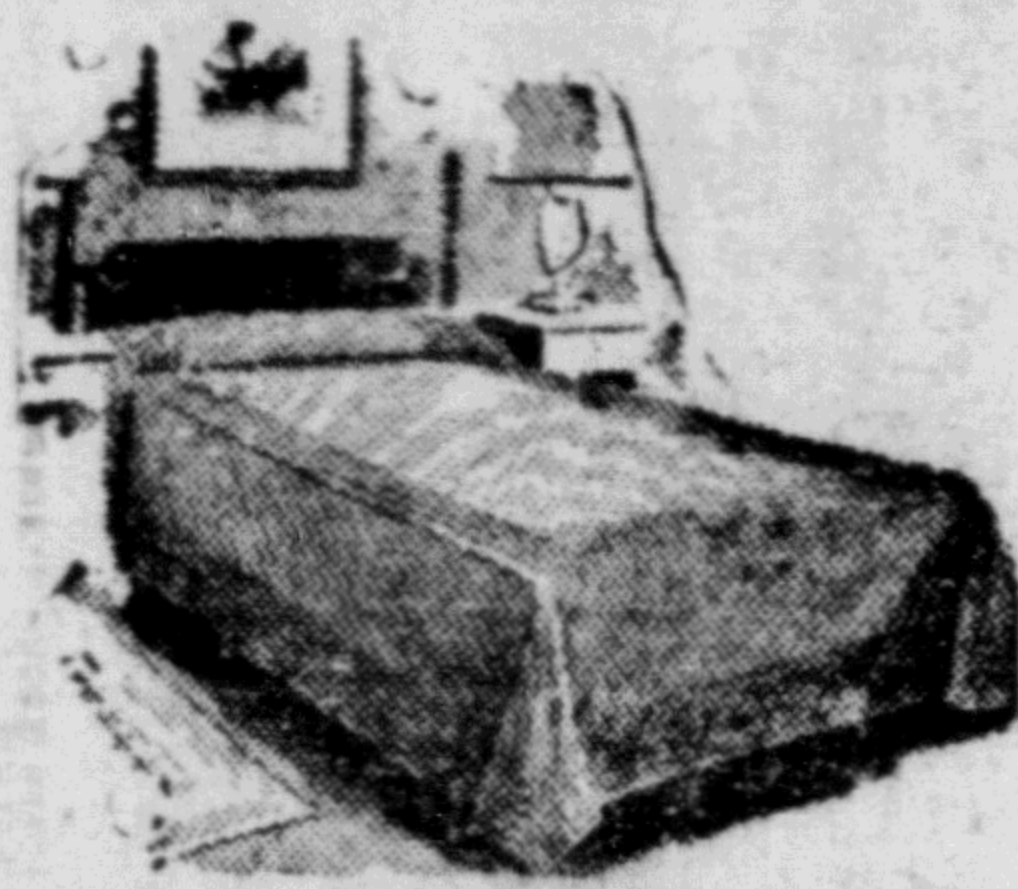

Backing For Hotel Urged

Frank Kafel Might Do Other Things for Prince Rupert

If Frank Kafel, dynamic Toronto and Vancouver financier, who has become interested in the establishment of a modern hotel at Prince Rupert and is the moving spirit in the Charles M. Hays Hotel project here, is encouraged in retaining that interest here, other benefits may accrue to the city. So declares Ed. Kellner, well known British Columbia mining man, who is in the city with Olier Besner on business in connection with the hotel project.

"The hotel may be but the first of other important and beneficial undertakings for Prince Rupert," Mr. Kellner predicted in an interview with the Daily News. "I have seen Kafel in operation not only in Canada and other countries. He is a man of action and tremendous enthusiasm and I have personal knowledge of many of his successful and enterprising projects. Prince Rupert people would do well to tag along with him."

Mr. Kellner said that Mr. Kafel was most anxious to see the hotel project here get moving quickly. It was reasonable that he should expect some local support. He had certainly met with opposition elsewhere but this had made him all the more anxious that the hotel here should be successfully consummated. "He is anxious that there should be a good, clear indication from the people of Prince Rupert now, not a year from now, that they want the hotel and are prepared to share in backing it."

It was Mr. Kellner who made the original contact between Olier Besner and Frank Kafel that resulted in the latter becoming interested in the local hotel project.

New Prince George Bridge Not Favored

On recommendation of its highway committee, the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce Monday night declined a request of the Prince George Board of Trade seeking endorsement of a resolution asking for the building of a new high level highway bridge across the Fraser River at Prince George. W. M. Watts, speaking for the highway committee, explained that the view had been taken that it was ill-advised to ask for major expenditure on a bridge such as was requested while highways generally were in need of improvement.

Officers Of Kinsmen Club

At a special annual meeting of the Kinsmen's Club of Prince Rupert at the Civic Centre Tuesday night, last year's President Ed Garner was re-elected to the presidency. Others elected were Vice-president Bill Long, Treasurer John Good, Secretary James Mellor, Recorder Bob Rudderham and Directors James Thomson and R. C. Barbour. The installation will take place after the summer recess.

Final plans were made for delegates to attend the regional Kinsmen Convention in Nanaimo June 3, 4 and 5. Local representatives will be Ed Garner, R. C. Barbour, William Long, R. E. Montador and James Thomson as voting delegates and Stan Saville as alternate.

Chairman Stan Saville of the May 24 ticket committee reported that the net profit from the sale of memberships would be just over \$1500. Ray McLean of the dance committee reported a net profit of \$452.97. Concessions chairman Harry Swaffield reported there would only be a slight profit from sale of food, etc., due to the hundreds of free ice creams and hot dogs given away to the youngsters at the Sport Day.
