

LONDON (P)-The Labor party yesterday called for Britain to keep out of further programs for European and political and economic union until unity minded continental countries adopted broad socialism.

The strong policy statement which rejected the French plan for pooling European coal and steel, came as Prime Minister Attlee prepared to explain to the Commons why his government is staying out of the June 20 six power talks on the plan.

Labor leaders fear mergers with Europe may jeopardise their rrogram of full employment and mounting production through government planning.
