Jasper Sees Busy Season

JASPER—Having ploughed its way out of the heaviest winter in the experience of its oldest inhabitant, this great national park in the heart of the Canadian Rockies stands ready to welcome an expected record-breaking number of visitors this summer.

For their added enjoyment the great new olympic-sized swimming pool is complete and ready for the summer's fun, and six fine tennis courts, part of the recreational development in Jasper Village, await the holiday seekers.

At Jasper Lodge, the Canadian National Railways' summer season show-place, which officially opens tomorrow, manager Harold Gunning is looking forward to another record-breaking summer.

"Our advance bookings are right up to those of last year," he said. "The Lodge grounds and buildings are in excellent shape, and the staff is all set and eager to go."

Mr. Gunning said the demand for places in the famous annual tottem pole golf tournament, scheduled for the week of September 4, is greater than ever. The three new holes which round out the nine-hole circuit on the championship tottem pole course will be in play for the first time this season. Guests of the Lodge also will be served by two specially-built buses which will be put into the Jasper-Columbia ice field run.

Jasper Park Lodge will be host this year to a number of conventions. On June 18 the American Dermatological Association will convene, to be followed by the Canadian Research Club. A great convention, to be attended by 550 persons, of the Phi Beta Phi fraternity, will be held from June 25 to July 1. Toward the end of the season, on August 29, the Automotive Electric Association will meet, and on August 31 the Western Association of Broadcasters will convene. A large convention of 400 members of the Sun Life Assurance Company will close the season at the Lodge. The first group will meet

from September 11 to 14 and the second from September 15 to 18.

Although the new swimming pool is actually in operation now, it will officially be opened on July 8 by Hon. Robert Winters Minister of Resources and Development.

Road Improvement

G. H. L. Dempster, park superintendent, said the park's program of road improvement is being vigorously pushed forward. The mile of highway from Cottonwood Creek Camp, on the east of Jasper Village, to the Lodge bridge across the Athabasca River, is being surfaced with an asphalt-bound base. As soon as this work is completed, the highway crew will start applying the same type of surface at the east gate of the park on the Jasper-Edmonton highway and work west back toward the village.

Reconstruction of the Columbia ice field highway is going on apace, and Mr. Dempster said it was hoped to reach mile 55 this summer. Last year the road was rebuilt to mile 30, and was partially reconstructed to mile 40. If mile 55 is reached this year it will leave only 14 more miles of roadwork to be done to the south boundary of the park.

Major Fred Brewster, famous Rocky Mountain personality, has acquired a new cruiser-type 20 passenger boat for service on Maligne Lake, and is presently engaged in dragging the two-ton vessel up the rugged pass for its launching.

For six solid weeks, said Major Brewster, the temperature in Jasper during the winter never rose above 20 degrees below zero. Maligne Lake is still frozen over, and there are six and one half feet of snow in the Tonquin Valley. Harry Rowed, noted mountain photographer and ski enthusiast, reported today that skiing on the upper levels of Marmot Basin is perfect.

As a result of the cold winter and heavy snow, the mountains surrounding Jasper have never appeared so beautiful this late in the season. Each one is crowned with a heavy cap of snow down to well below the timber line, and they gleam and glisten in the warm June sun shine which Jasper is enjoying at the present time.
