CANADIANS HAVE MORE
(continued from Page 1)last year and representing 50
per cent of total assets.

The number of bank shareholders is on the increase, Mr. Boyer noted, going up from 50,000 before the war to 60,000 today. Dividends paid in 1949 averaged \$252 per shareholder. For every dollar paid in dividends in 1949, the banks paid \$6.30 in salaries and wages, 73 cents in contributions to staff pension funds, \$3.64 in interest to depositors and \$1.43 in taxes, including municipal.

Referring to job-creating investment opportunities in Canada, Mr. Boyer gave as an illustration the \$150,000,000 in venture capital being spent by 240 companies in oil development in western Canada, particularly Alberta, this year. Much of this risk money came from outside Canada and in its wake flowed jobs, people, new industries and the expansion of old industries. There will be \$125,000,000 in new buildings in Alberta this year, as a direct result of the oil development—stores, houses, churches, schools, all making jobs and production.

"In the new discoveries of oil in western Canada," Mr. Boyer continued, "the mineral finds of Chibougamau, the iron and titanium of Quebec and Labrador, in the uranium of the great northwest, the gold and copper and other minerals of northern Ontario and Quebec, British Columbia and Newfoundland and also in the farms of the prairies, the forests and fisheries elsewhere in Canada, are opportunities almost fabulous.

"This is a country generously endowed by nature with most of the raw materials which make possible a high standard of living. Canadians have a heritage of resources in forest, mine, farm and ocean second to none. Ours is the best country in the world. Canadians have resources, plant and equipment to provide an ever-increasing flow of the things the rest of the world needs. We have a banking system second to none, and Canadians generally have the capital for all sound requirements. The people are Canada's most valuable asset—possessed of intelligence, initiative, industry, skill

and courage. All of the ingredients are there.

BASIS OF PROSPERITY

"Work and thrift, investment and enterprise—these have been the basis of all prosperity through all the ages. It holds true for Canadians today."

In surveying general economic trends, Mr. Boyer said 1949 showed strength in the Canadian economy and 1950 looked like another good year. The one cloud on the horizon was overseas markets, a product of war and post-war economic dislocation and disruption of multi-lateral trading.

"Until the grave problems of the United Kingdom's sterling balances is resolved," Mr. Boyer continued, "the situation must continue a source of anxiety and effort. The democratic world cannot forever function successfully in the water-tight compartments of two currency areas and two separate and irreconcilable price plateaus."

THREAT OVER WORLD

Overhanging the world today is the fear and menace of communism seeking world domination, Mr. Boyer said. All human activity is conditioned by it.

"Whatever the defects of the democratic system by which Canadians live," he continued, "there is a freedom and a standard of living unmatched in the world, save possibly in the United States—a standard which communism has not succeeded in producing anywhere in the world, notwithstanding communism's totalitarian enslaving power. Nor has socialism, nor any other system.

"We have our problems here, and we solve them in democratic freedom, by virtue of enterprise and opportunity. Recent months produced one problem, now being alleviated—that of a labor force increasing and jobs increasing too, but not as fast. Therefore, unemployment, which rose steadily for a time, despite the fact that more people had jobs and payrolls were higher than ever and still rising. I feel that at least substantially the solution of this anomaly lies in the field of investment, and in stimulating more Canadians to invest their own money in the profitable developing of the resources and rich opportunities of their own country. It is not beyond the resourcefulness of a free enterprise economy. I have great confidence in the practical intelligence of free Canadians when well informed."

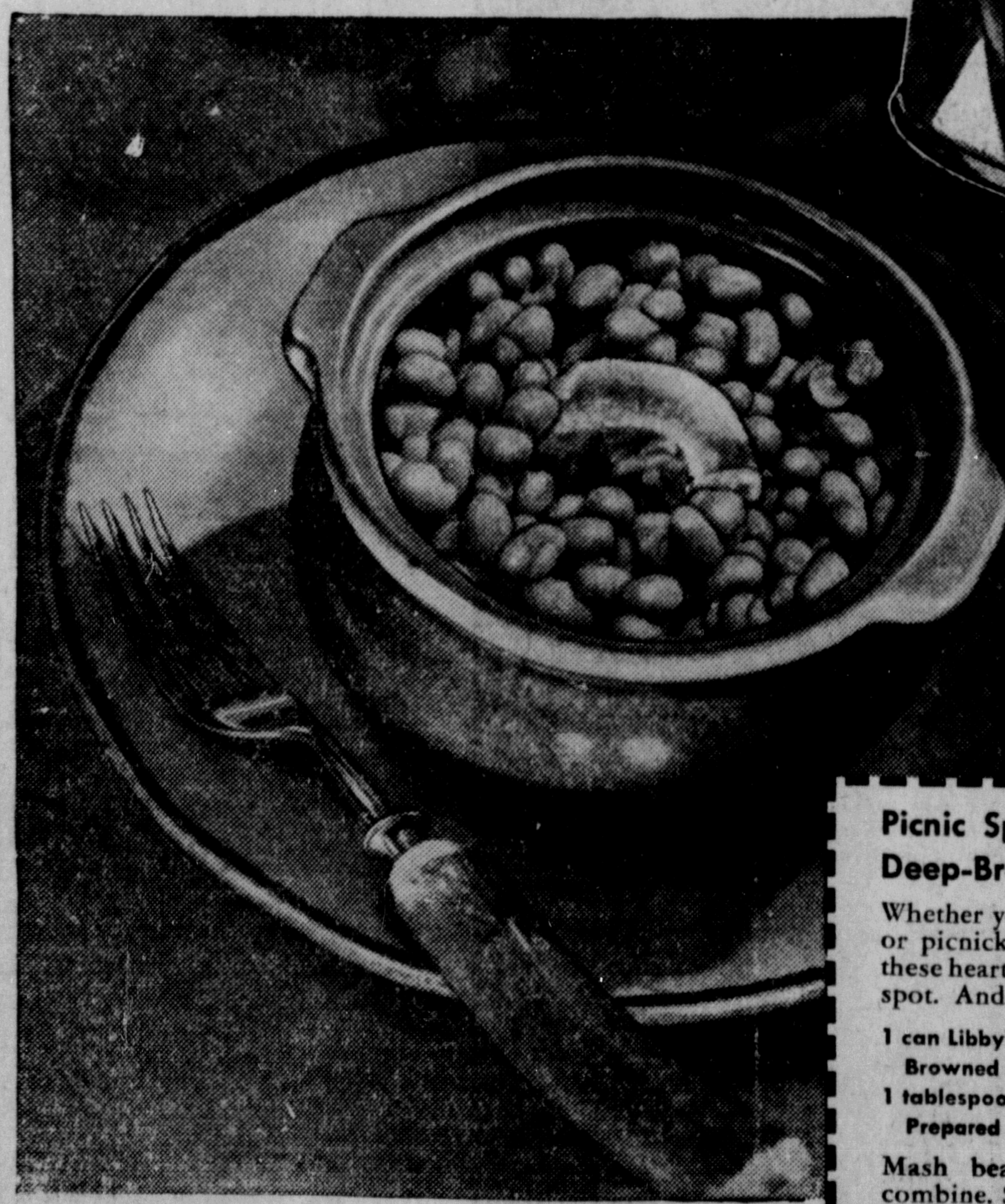
