Jets Win Northern B.C. Hoop Title; In Running For Provincial Title

Prince Rupert Downs Kitimaat Decisively In Concluding Play-off Game

The Prince Rupert Jets will, for the third consecutive year, play in the British Columbia Senior B Basketball finals. This year they have the satisfaction of having earned the right to enter the finals through winning the Northern British Columbia championship. It is the first year since they have been

accepted in to the play-offs they have had competition in their own district. Last night the Jets defeated Kitimaat by a 56 to 39 score and walked away with the two-game series by an overall score of 105 to 85.

It was a vastly different game from that of Saturday night when Kitimaat had the edge most of the way. Last night the Jets were at their best. Their shooting was on and they excelled on a fast-breaking play that netted them basket after basket. Kitimaat didn't have the fire they showed on Saturday. Their floor play was still excellent and, as fine as any ever seen here, but they did not have the spark that brought them to victory in the native tournament and near victory in the first game of the series. During the first half of the game they managed to keep close to the Jets, being just 3 points down 15 to 12, at the end of the quarter, and two points down 24 to 22, at the half. The

Jets were really jet-propelled in the final half when they scored thirty points while Kitimaat was getting just half that number.

For the Jets, Spring was high with 13, and Don Scherk and Rup Holkestad each scored 11.

Chris Wilson again demonstrated his value to the Kitimaat team, scoring 17 big points, although definitely off in his shooting. Grant who scored 18 in the first game was held down last night, and scored only 2 points.

The Kitimaats were too anxious all evening and overshot the basket a great deal. Their anxiety cost them a good many fouls, 21 in all.

The Jets made 15 fouls, and scored 14 of 22 free throws.

Kitimaat converted 7 of 15 possibilities. The arbiters were Comadina and Calderone and they did a top-notch job.

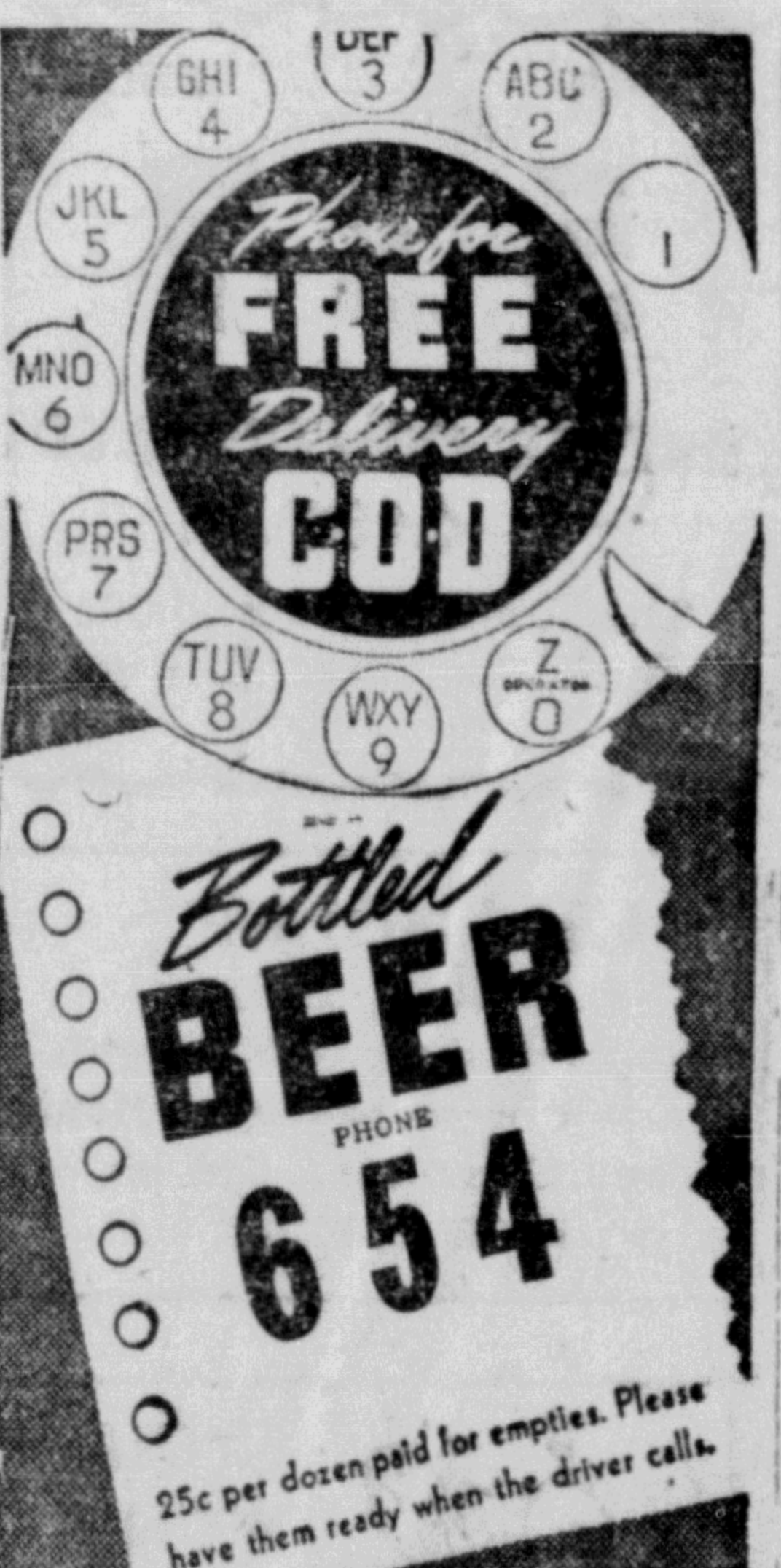
