

Beyond Portland Canal Described

BEYOND PORTLAND
New information has been added to the scant knowledge of that region of peaks, glaciers and icefields lying beyond the Portland Canal and the headwaters of the Salmon Gold River, in the Coast Mountains of north-western British Columbia.

In the summer of 1949 a British

expedition made up of Captain C. H. Pelham-Burn, Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, his cousin, Michael Cox, botanist and mountaineer, and Captain R. C. Curtis, surveyor, penetrated the territory and spent three months making observations and climbing four peaks, one of which, 9,800 feet high, supported seven glaciers.

Writing in the August issue of the Canadian Geographical Journal, Captain Pelham-Burn reports on his findings. The article is illustrated by photographs taken by the author and M. G. Cox.

The party flew to Bowser Lake,

which is set in a glacial valley and which made an ideal base camp for the dozen or so side-trips made by the explorers. One of the maps with which they had been provided showed a body of water named Tide Lake on which they had intended to land, but all they found there was an alluvial flat. The glacier which had formed the dam which created the lake had receded, and the "tide" had gone out.

Few of the peaks of the area have been named and only a small proportion appear on maps. The geological and geographical data gathered, as well as botanical specimens which are now in the British Museum, will prove of interest and value. Captain Pelham-Burn and his companions found wild life abundant and easy to observe. The birds were remarkably varied, and the article contains a list of 53 ornithological species identified during the summer.

Although the nature of forest and plant growth shows that the annual rainfall must be relatively high, it was not excessive while the party was in the Bowser Valley. The author states that much remains to be learned about this country, and many fine peaks are still to be climbed.
