RADIO STATION AT HOBBY SHOW

Messages to be Accepted For All Part of Province

In one corner of the Civic Centre gymnasium during the Hobby Show this year, there will be a new feature. The Prince Rupert Amateur Radio Association will set up and operate an amateur radio station so as to show what facilities they have and how they work. The public will be given the opportunity to write out messages which will be sent to most any place in British Columbia. Operators in other towns are being informed of the dates of the Hobby Show—April 27 to 30, so they will be listening in on those evenings.

By relaying messages through Vancouver stations it is hoped to be able to deliver messages to the principal cities of Canada and the States.

Plans are being worked out for other features of the Hobby Show. The shellcraft groups are planning a large and varied display.

Rug hooking promises to be an important part of the show, as many beautiful rugs have been made this winter. It is hoped that someone with an unfinished rug will bring it down and put in some time showing how the hooking is done.
