HONORED BY RED CROSS
Medals Presented to Three Terrace Women
Terrace—Medals for meritorious service in Red Cross work were presented to Mrs. Will Robinson, Mrs. W. Ross Thomson and Mrs. Geoffrey Hamlin by James Stevenson, president of the local branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society, following the reading of citations at Friday night's meeting of the Red Cross executive in the nurses' lounge of the Outpost Hospital. Their work extended over a period of years, including the war period and they had shown a complete devotion to the cause. The plea of Mrs. Robinson at an annual meeting in Vancouver to which she was a delegate, was largely instrumental in having the hospital established here.
A letter from Colonel C. A. Scott was read in which he asked that a resolution passed at the recent annual meeting of the Central Council be conveyed to all persons concerned. It read in part: "The Central Council of the Canadian Red Cross Society pays tribute to many thousands of voluntary workers whose continued interest and zeal is assuring the success of the very enlarged peacetime program of this Society."
Reporting for the works committee, Mrs. Thomson said that sewing and knitting is still going on.
The new hospital matron, Miss Evelyn Spence, R.N., was welcomed to Terrace.
The meeting was turned over to Mrs. Norington, chairman of the Blood Donor Clinic drive, who gave an explanation of the work and what was expected from the donors of whom it was hoped to have at least 200. The canvassers were asked to state specifically to each prospective donor that there are no ill effects after giving blood. The body itself replaces the loss within an hour. The local help for the clinic which will be held on August 4 was organized and the districts allotted to the canvassers who were listed as follows: Mrs. Hobenschield, Mrs. Head, Mrs. W. IS WINNER OF SCHOLARSHIP
Elmore Hankinson Distinguishes Himself in Studies at Winnipeg
A graduate in architecture at the University of Manitoba at Winnipeg, Elmore I. Hankinson, 26, son of the late Dr. C. H. Hankinson of Prince Rupert, has been awarded the Pilkington travelling scholarship for this year.
The scholarship is awarded each year in the national competition between Canadian schools of architecture and includes a grant of \$1,500 plus travelling expenses.
Elmore Hankinson, a native of Prince Rupert, served with the fleet air arm of the Royal Navy before going to the University of Manitoba. He has been working with the construction office of the T. Eaton

Company in Winnipeg. He intends to study in England at either the University of Liverpool or London University and on the continent.
