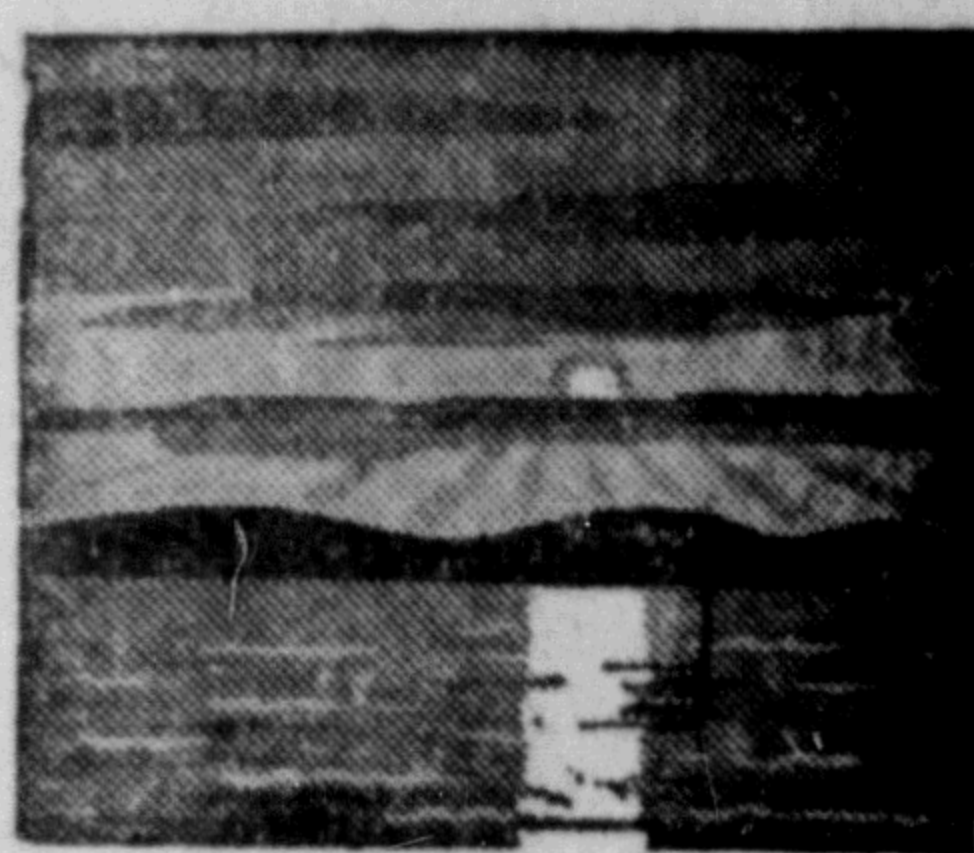

Great Herring Harvest in Ogden Channel—
New Cannery on Ocean Dock Proceeding

Within one period of 24 hours the herring fleet fishing in Ogden Channel had taken a bumper catch of 2500 tons, according to the Department of Fisheries. Eighteen seines were used. Total herring catch for the northern sub-district so far was 5139 tons up to 2 p.m. Thursday. For the southern sub-district a catch of 3200 tons was recorded up to Tuesday, while Thursday, using 11 seines, 1200 tons were caught. To date 19,200 tons of herring is recorded for the central sub-districts. Herring has been pouring into Nelson Bros. Ltd. reduction plant all this week but has had to be turned away to plants down coast because the Northern B.C. Power Co. was unable to furnish power to operate the Port Edward plant, involving a serious loss to the company as well as employment for workers. The big run is exceptionally early this year.

Work on the new Prince Rupert cannery of Canadian Fishing Company on the ocean dock is progressing on schedule, according to A. Van Snellenberg, mechanical supervisor for the company. Construction of the cement floor for the building is well under way and should be completed by Christmas, Mr. Van Snellenberg said yesterday.

Installation of boilers and electric lines will be started in the new year. Preliminary work on water lines has been completed and the can making machine installed. Twenty men are now employed in construction. The plant, when completed, will have double the capacity of the Carls plant, which it replaces. It is expected about 150 employees will be needed to operate it. Applications for employment will be received after the first of the year.
