ECONOMY OR UNIFICATION
 OTTAWA—Public pressure may force unification of the railways unless they effect greater economies in operation, the royal commission on transportation was told today.

Dr. E. C. Hope, economist of the Canadian Federation of Agriculture, made this statement as he testified on a Federation brief calling for more railway efficiency and economy.

Dr. Hope said that statutory low rates on grain movements in the west should continue under jurisdiction of Parliament.

Wednesday Set For Appeal Date

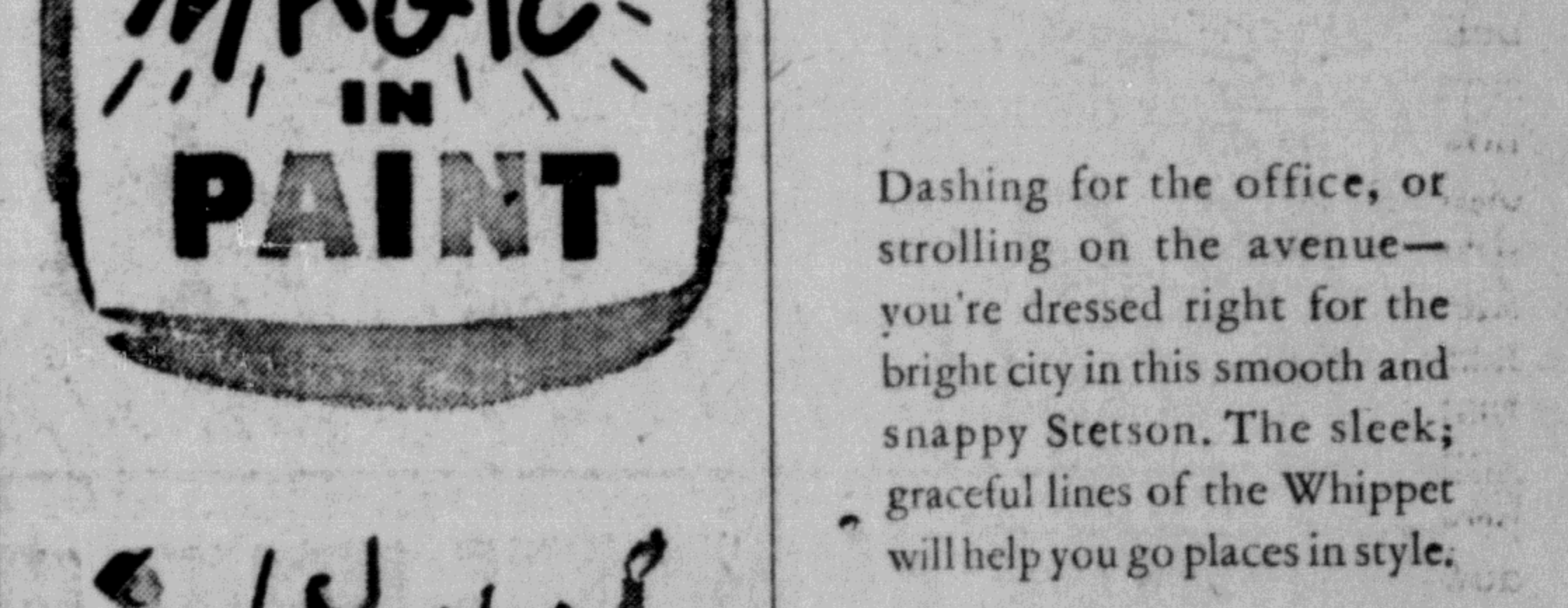
