

**BASKETBALL—  
Bo-Me-Hi Makes The Highest Score Of Season To Date**

**Fashion Takes Lead In Intermediate League — Junior High's First Win**

Basketball on Saturday night at the Civic Centre gym saw Bo-Me-Hi rack up the highest score this season, Fashion take over first place in the Intermediate League and High School Juniors cop their first win of the year.

The Senior game went to Bo-Me-Hi by the score of 68 to 36 over Brownwoods. After the first quarter, in which they played their best ball and held Bo-Me-Hi on even terms, Brownwoods fell apart and Bo-Me-Hi sprang into the lead. The first quarter ended 12 to 11 for Brownwoods. Fast breaks and shooting in the second quarter gave Rainmakers the lead at the half 22 to 14.

In the second half the school boys went all-out with every player taking part in the scoring parade. Brownwoods' ball playing, shooting and defensive play fell apart before the Rainmakers' onslaught. Everything worked out right for the High players as they jumped in baskets with only a small return by the shoemen. In the third quarter Bo-Me-Hi scored 25 points which is tops for the season and also is higher than last year's mark. There was no weakening of the offensive power shown by Bo-Me-Hi in the final 10 minutes as they continued to build their lead high-roller Glen Carlson came through with 10 points in the final quarter to lead his team as high scorer of the evening.

Bo-Me-Hi's fast breaking play rocked Brownwoods' defence and found big holes through which they thereby qualifying to take part in the semi-finals. Games to be played in the semi-finals will be between John Bulger and the winner of Geo. Abbott vs. J. Campbell match which is scheduled for tonight, and Dick Simonson and the winner of Geo. Dawes vs. Harry Normond match for which no date has yet been set.
