

PROSPECTORS TO COPPER RIVER

TELKWA—D. C. Mawhinney and G. Llewellyn of Copper River left this week for the headwaters of the Copper River, travelling from Telkwa up the Telkwa River and across the divide to the head of the Copper River to build cabins and prepare for a season of prospecting. They had been in Telkwa for a week assembling supplies and equipment for a dog team to allow for snow travel. They are taking in supplies for a three months initial trip.

D. C. Mawhinney is an old timer, having prospected in various parts of Alaska and Northern British Columbia for about forty years. Mr. Llewellyn is a veteran of the Spanish War. They are both very capable men in the hills. This part of the country has been neglected for a good many years although it is very rich in mineral, timber and coal. It is hoped this will lead to development and eventually to a road from Telkwa to Terrace which will allow much faster progress in this section.

LIFE in this Prince Rupert by BIDDEE JINKS

I like my country. Just as it is, with its wide miles of prairie that blisters in the heat of summer and flicks the skin white with the cold whip of winter; its lakes that lie in their beds, frozen and pale, or bright under summer skies; the mountains, hiding their native goats in gullies and crags, luring men up their sides while the rest of us gaze in the quietude of full wonder upon their rugged, changeless, yet ever changing beauty.

I like my country, just as it is. I have always liked it since the first day I felt the full warmth of the sun sweep across a lazy hilltop; but after hearing John Hladun, ex-Communist, speak in the Civic Centre, I like it today better than ever before.

Hereto, my feelings on the subject of Communism were based on the suspicion that surrounds any threat to some long established part of Canadian life. From varied and contradicting articles written on the subject, which all of us read and take to our hearts the ones most in line with preconceived ideas. From "Out of the Night"—as much as I could bear to read—which was sheathed in the cry of "Propaganda."

Then, before the last election I got a closer look. Three successive, individual calls were made on me by three separate electioneers, all sworn to "The Cause." They said they were not Communists, but L.P.P.'s. They, and several others had been sent into Prince Rupert from headquarters, wherever that might be. It could have been Moscow, for each spoke with filial fervor of the Fatherland, so glibly, so readily, that back lanes and side streets of Moscow might have been the setting for their childhood game, Run-Sheep-Run. But no; none of them had been outside of Canada—this land that willfully wrongs and suppresses its people, but is nevertheless so free with its freedom that these and other Communists are trained while nurtured in its very bosom.

These men were completely irreligious. There was no God. They spoke dispassionately of religious faith—of God—somehow as one might survey a piece of furniture and say, "The upholstery on that arm needs a little mending."

This was not a part of an early training. One had been raised a Baptist, (three brothers and his father are even now in his own conscience. He had met

one Canadian, once a student like himself, whose passport disappeared with his faith in Communism, and who never saw his Canadian home again.

Concern for his personal safety brings a grim smile to Mr. Hladun's lips. He has received his share of "notes," and tossed them in the waste basket. Says he: "I am a Canadian. Telling me what to do in Canada is the wrong thing."

More than that, he knows every trick of the trade. That knowledge is his safety. "We are not too late to stop Red advancement into Labor Unions," says John Hladun. Correction of the administrative irritants that make working people prey to Communism, and keeping awake to the threat is all we need."

And those words sounded good!
