CITY RED CROSS DRIVE PASSES TWO-THIRD MARK

The city's Red Cross campaign bettered two-thirds of its \$3,000 quota during the last few days and was given extra impetus by completion of the Chinese canvass which netted more than \$200 from 65 sources.

Campaign total today stands at \$2,320, chairman S. H. Saville reported, including \$205 turned in by Earl Mah and Ling Bo Shong, Chinese canvassers.

Although it is now in its fifth week, Mr. Saville plans to keep the entry book open at least another week in an effort to raise the \$3,000 quota within the city. Originally a three-week campaign was scheduled.

"Considering the importance of the work the Red Cross is doing to maintain and expand Canada's health standards, our quota is small enough," he said. "I'm sure we can fill it, even though it takes extra time."

Mr. Saville expressed satisfaction at the result of the canvass of the Chinese population and paid tribute to Mr. Mah and Mr. Ling, the canvassers.

"Our Chinese population is not very big, but they have come through in fine style," he commented.

He believes that many among the white population have unwittingly neglected to send in donations, either because they were missed by the canvassers or because it has slipped their minds.

"One man phoned me the other day and asked me how the drive was coming," Mr. Saville recalled. "When I told him 'slow' he said that he had been out when the canvasser called and hadn't given the matter any thought until he saw a report of the drive in the Daily News. He mailed a \$50 check."

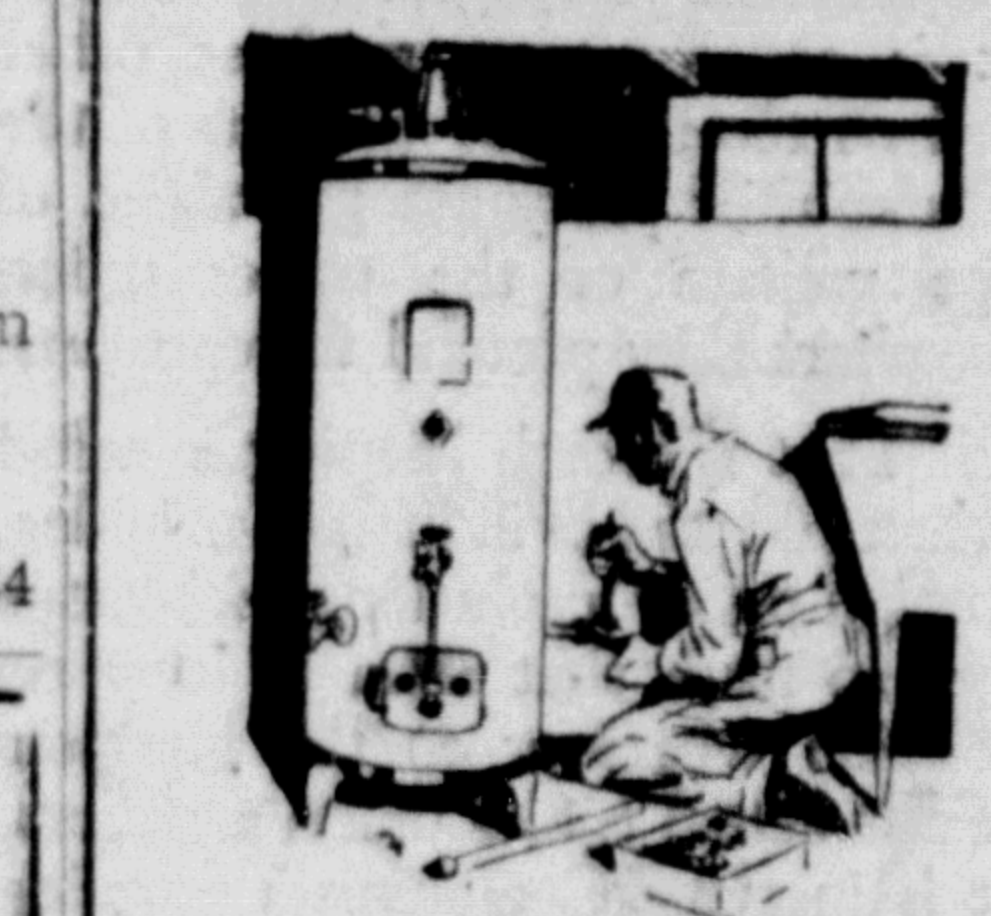
