Ray Reflects and Reminisces

A lot of us continue to have plain and fancy troubles. But it might be worse. Here in British Columbia no more adults of both sexes are removing their clothing, and declining to dress.

It will be refreshing again to hear more or less noise in the railway yards at Prince Rupert. The days and nights of uncanny silence get on anyone's nerves. An there was a certain mournfulness to gaze around, and see nothing with life in it. And one missed the hum of spinning tires, driving to or from boats and trains each day or evening. There was always some sort of action that compelled attention, even though it might be slight. Life was becoming too much like staying too long in a cemetery.

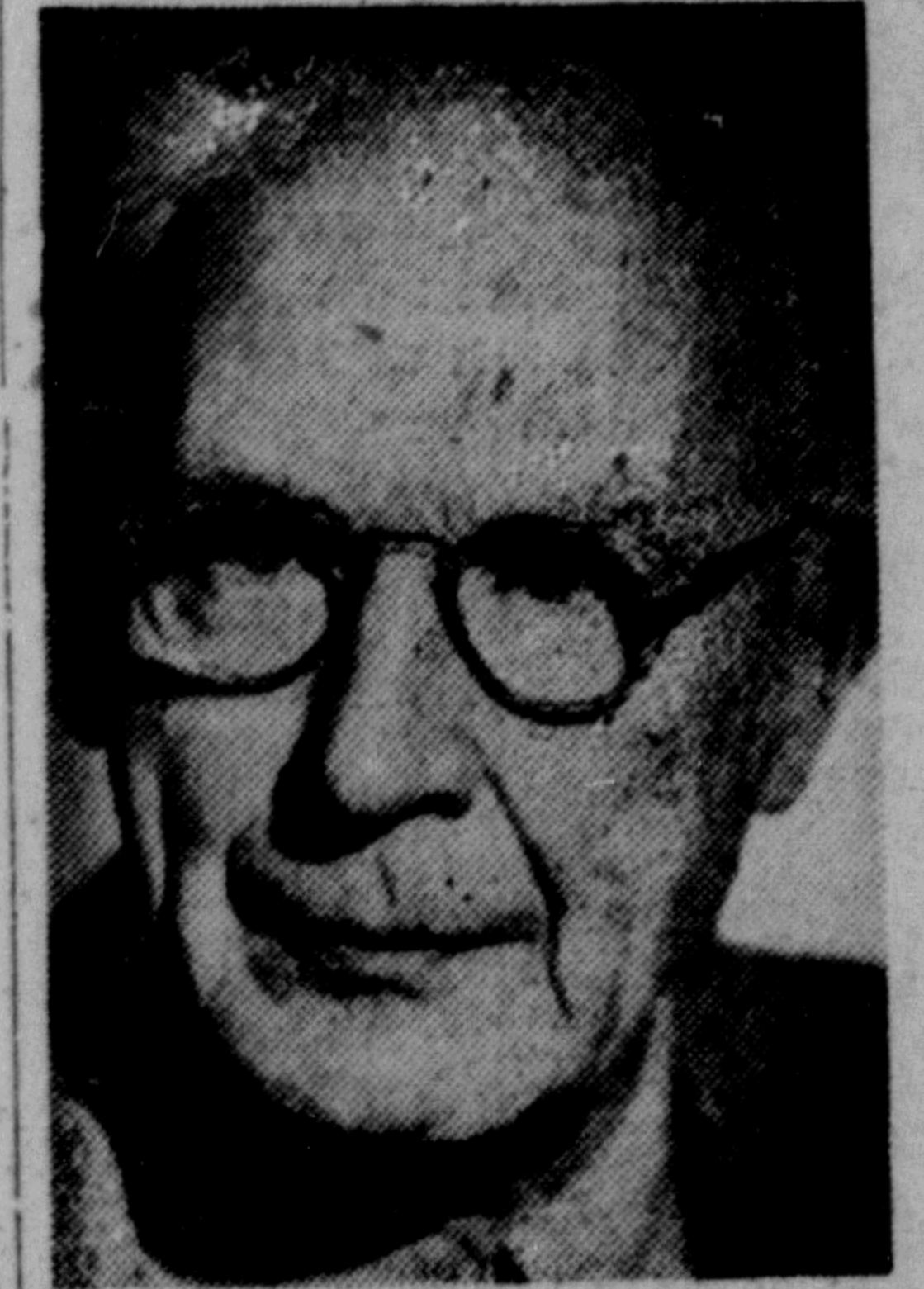
