/ E are all confident, of course, of the eventual successful outcome of the campaign in South Korea, to the liberation of which from the comnumist aggressors the United Nations is committed. We cannot, however, be too complacent about the seriousness of the situation there. The North Koreans are across the Kum River, which was to have been the firm line for the Americans to hold. The provision capital of Taejon has been evacuated and American expeditionary forces are threatened with being cut off. Another "Dunkerque" operation is hinted.

Of most serious significance of all is the sudden and urgent appeal of the Secretary General of the United Nations for "effective, not token," ground forces to assist the South Koreans and the hardpressed American forces. Canada is one of the nations that is thus appealed to. Such an appeal makes it look like thigs are really bad.

If the United Nations was faced with only South Korea, it would not be so bad. Once there is proper organization, that situation could probably be cleaned up quickly enough even though the starting odds are predominantly in favor of the big and powerful organized force which moved in its own good time against an admittedly unready defence.

The more serious possibility is that Korea may only be a diversion and that more and larger thrusts, depending on the immediate results in South Korea, may develop elsewhere. That is why it is alarming that a relatively minor conflict in Korea should be Monday morning at 9:30 in First requiring so much attention and so heavy fighting resources. 
