



This 25' wide by 16' deep house makes the most of all its available space. The kitchen, following the new trend, is long, providing adequate dining space with a convenient working area. The large clothes closets are the features of the two upstairs bedrooms. The first floor exterior is shown with brick veneer construction, and the second floor with frame construction and horizontal wood siding, but the dimensions on the working drawings are so arranged that the first floor may be built in frame or solid brick if desired. The minimum lot width required for National Housing Act financing is 37' and the area for estimating purposes is 800 square feet.



SMART AS PEOPLE THESE GORILLAS—Sinbad, youngest of the infant gorillas whose "mental alertness" is being studied by students at Roosevelt college in Chicago, registers frustration as he tries to take a shortcut in solving one of a battery of problem-solving tests. This test consists of having two strings, one baited with the animal's favorite fruit, laid out in different patterns on the board outside his cage. If he pulls the right string, the gorilla is rewarded with the attached fruit. Here Sinbad first takes the easy way out by attempting to grab the fruit without even worrying about the problem, then, having learned that you can't get anywhere in life without pulling strings, he proceeded to solve the crossed-string test 49 times out of 50 in the first series of trials. The tests, which started as a student project in animal behavior courses, have revealed that gorillas are almost as smart as anybody.
