Inquiry In Sea Crash

MIAMI (C)—A searching investigation began Wednesday into the crash of a C-42 plane in which 28 Puerto Ricans apparently lost their lives. Thirty-seven survivors, rescued by the destroyer Saufley arrived at Charleston yesterday.

Eight are known dead and scant hope is held for 20 others who were aboard the plane that went down in the Atlantic 275 miles east of here Monday night. The hunt for survivors was continued during the day.



FOR TOP QUALITY—Some of the very finest vegetables ever produced in Canada are grown in the far north, in the Yukon or on the shores of Great Bear Lake. And the reason for this is not extra good soil, as a matter of fact the soil is usually poor, but extra hours of sunlight. Quick unchecked growth is the real secret of tender vegetables and it is possible to grow that kind anywhere in Canada if just a little care is taken.

In the first place one must have good seeds and of varieties that are suitable to local conditions. Next, the vegetable garden should be thoroughly cultivated or dug, then the seed planted according to directions on the packet. Spacing is important, as crowded plants never have a chance to develop quickly. Cultivation once a week will usually be sufficient itself to keep growth coming along even in the driest weather. If a hose is available, however, that will be another safeguard. A little chemical fertilizer applied carefully and according to directions is also advisable.

And another important point—spread out sowings. If all the carrots or all the beets are planted on one afternoon then they will all mature at the same time. By sowing a row or so every other week from early spring until late June or even early July for most vegetables and for most parts of the country, one will assure a succession of crops right at their best. In some staple lines like beans, lettuce, beets, carrots and such, there should be some of these just coming into bearing from early July until frost.

Enrolment Increasing

Seventy-three More Pupils This Year than Last In Schools

School enrolment in city and district schools with the exception of Booth and Digby Island, during last month was much higher than during the same month last year, it was revealed at a meeting of the Prince Rupert Public School Board last night. Total enrolment in May was 1232. In May 1949 total was 1159.

At King Edward, although enrolment was 302 as compared with 287 in May 1949, it dropped as compared with other months this term due to families leaving for the fishing grounds. During previous months this year, enrolment hovered around the 305 mark.

Booth last month dropped from 433 last year to an enrolment figure of 425 this year. The percentage attendance (89.1) was also lower than last year's 91 per cent.

Digby Island's enrolment dropped by only one point as compared to May in 1949 when 22 pupils attended, although attendance percentage shot up from 92 per cent last year to 99.42 per cent in May this year.

All city and district schools with the exception of Digby Island, dropped in percentage attendance. Port Edward and Port Simpson dropped more than ten points.
