WOULD SELL HOCKEY TEAM

Paul Thompson interested in Buying New Westminster Royals

VANCOUVER (C)—Paul Thompson, former National Hockey League star, said Friday that he was interested in buying the New Westminster Royals, pace-setters in the Pacific Coast Hockey League. Owner Kenry C. McKenzie put the "For Sale" sign on the team Thursday as a climax to a dispute with Coly Hall, owner of the Vancouver Canucks. "If Kenry is serious about selling, I am willing to talk business," said Thompson.

McKenzie refused to disclose the price he is asking but hockey authorities believe it will take from \$30,000 to \$50,000. The sale would have to have league approval.

The owner of the Royals said he had been "embarrassed and humiliated" by Hall during the Royals-Canucks game on Tuesday night here which ended in a three-all tie. "He struck me on the back and called me unprintable names," said McKenzie. "It would be untenable for me to have the two of us in the same organization."

Hall charged McKenzie with using him as an excuse to sell the Royals.
